Introduction :

The Central Sanskrit Board was set up by the Central Government in 1956 in pursuance of the recommendations made by the Sanskrit Commission appointed by Government of India to make recommendations in regard to the measures to be taken for the promotion of Sanskrit. As a result of the recommendations of the Board a Kendriya Sanskrit Vidyapeetha was established at Tirupati by Ministry of Education in 1962, its primary objectives being teaching and research in specialised branches of Sanskrit learning. In 1967 Shri Lal Bahadur Shastri Kendriya Sanskrit Vidyapeetha, Delhi was taken over and established as the second Sanskrit Vidyapeetha. It was felt that it would be desirable to set up more centres for Sanskrit studies and research.

The Kendriya Sanskrit Parishad suggested in 1970 the creation of a central body which could take steps to establish more Kendriya Sanskrit Vidyapeethas and coordinate their work. As a consequence the Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan came into existence in October, 1970 as an autonomous body registered under the Societies Registration Act XXI of 1860 under the Ministry of Education & Culture,

Government of India. Immediately after its formation, three more Sanskrit Institutions, each at Jammu, Allahabad and Puri were taken over and converted into Kendriya Sanskrit Vidyapeethas under the Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan. The sixth Kendriya Sanskrit Vidyapeetha was established in Guruvayoor (Kerala) in July, 1977 by taking over a private Sanskrit institution. More recently a Kendriya Sanskrit Vidyapeetha has been established in Jaipur (Rajasthan) in July, 1983 to fulfil the objectives of the Sansthan, thus bringing the total number of Vidyapeethas to seven.

The Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan has provided an effective central mechanism for implementing the various recommendations made by the Sanskrit Commission with regard to the propagation and development of Sanskrit language and education in all its aspects. The Sansthan also advises the Government of India (Ministry of Education) in the formulation of various schemes and plans for the development of Sanskrit studies. Apart from providing training courses, it conducts research, brings out publications and edits and compiles rare manuscripts.

The main function of the Kendriya Sanskrit Vidyapeethas and the affiliated institutions is teaching in accordance with the courses of studies prescribed by the Sansthan from Prathama to Acharya. These courses run parallel to modern system of education.

With a view to fit in the emerging pattern of education the Sansthan has switched over to the 10+2 pattern in school education from the session 1981-82. Accordingly

the Madhyama course of the Sansthan has been divided into four years having two years course for Poorva Madhyama and further two years course for Uttar Madhyama. The Sansthan has also introduced a buffer course called Prak Shastri in which a student having passed class 10th examination of a Board may be admitted without any previous background of Sanskrit. This is a two years course with greater emphasis on Sanskrit studies.

Every year the affiliated institutions are inspected to ensure their satisfactory working. Accordingly all the affiliated institutions were inspected during October and November, 1983.

MANAGEMENT OF THE SANSTHAN

The Sansthan's headquarters are at Delhi. The Kendriya Sanskrit Vidyapeethas which are located in different parts of the country are academically, administratively and financially controlled by the Sansthan, which has constituted four main bodies for discharging its functions. These include the General Body, Shasi Parishad, Artha Samiti and Vidya Parishad. The General Body or Sabha is the Policy making organisation of the Sansthan. The Education Minister is the Chairman of the Sabha. It meets once in a year. Its composition in 1983-84 has been indicated in Annexure-A. The annual meeting of the General Body was held on March 27, 1984.

The Shasi Parishad is responsible for administrative functions. It meets twice a year. The composition of the Parishad for the year 1983-84 is indicated at **Annexure B**. During the year under report, it met twice in August, 1983 and March, 1984.

The Artha Samiti is responsible for financial management. The composition of the Artha Samiti for the year 1983-84 is indicated at **Annexure-C**. It met on 25th August, 1983, 13th December, 1983 and 24th March, 1984 during 1983-84. The Vidya Parishad (Academic Council) which performs academic functions such as preparation of syllabi and scheme of examinations, formulation of academic and research programmes etc., is the chief organ for guiding and supervising in all academic matters. **Annexure-D** indicates the composition of the Academic Council for the year 1983-84. A meeting of the council was held on Nov., 25th, 1983.

With a view to streamlining various academic activities and scheme of examination, the Sansthan sets up other committees and sub-committees, like Syllabus Committee, Board of Studies, Research Board, Examination Board, etc. which work in accordance with the guidelines given by the Academic Council.

The Director of the Sansthan is the Chairman of the Academic Council, Examination Board and Research Board. Each Vidyapeetha has separate Research Committees which examine students desirous of conducting research

work and recommends them to the Research Board of the Sansthan for registration as research scholars. The syllabus prepared subject-wise and compiled according to the scheme of studies by the Syllabus Committee is put up before the Board of Studies for review. The Board of Studies may introduce new subjects or withdraw the existing ones from the curriculum. Various faculties headed by the Deans who are normally Principals of the constituent Vidyapeethas, have been constituted.

STAFFING PATTERN AND WORKING OF THE RASHTRIYA SANSKRIT SANSTHAN

Headquarters Office

The Sansthan is the Central academic, administrative and examining body. It controls financial, administrative and academic activities of the Kendriya Sanskrit Vidyapeethas. The Director is the Principal executive Officer responsible for the execution of the policies of the Sansthan. He is at present assisted by five Deputy Directors and a Deputy Controller (Examination). The work of the Sansthan has been divided into four broad areas and sections created to deal with each of them. The four sections of the Sansthan include Academic, Examination, Administration and Finance. Each section is headed by a Deputy Director, except the Examination Section which is headed by a

Deputy Controller (Examination). While the Examination Section has a three tier administration, other sections have only a two tier staffing pattern. The main functions of the four sections are :—

Academic Section

The Academic Section has been bifurcated as under :

Performance Unit

Research and Publication Unit

Correspondence Course Unit

Performance Unit

The performance unit is headed by a Deputy Director and is mainly responsible for setting standards for educational performance. The main functions of this unit include preparation of a calendar for the academic programme, designing of syllabus, granting of affiliations and award of scholarship for encouraging study of Sanskrit.

Calendar

The calendar gives details of courses and the schedule of activities of the Sansthan. The calendar is normally printed every year.

Syllabus

The Sansthan has designed a curriculum of studies on the lines suggested under the scheme of re-organised sanskrit education which was approved by the Ministry of

Education and Culture on the advice of Central Sanskrit Board and University Grants Commission. The syllabus provides details about various disciplines such as modern Indian Language, History, Mathematics, English, Hindi, Sociology, Political Science, Economics etc.. Teaching, Research, Publication and preservation of manuscripts and the traditional pattern of education constitute the five major aspects of the academic functions of the Sansthan.

Affiliation

At present seven Kendriya Sanskrit Vidyapeethas are functioning at different places of the country. Besides the Sansthan grants affiliation for the purpose of examinations to a number of Adarsh Sanskrit Pathshalas established under the scheme of the Ministry of Education & Culture and also to a number of private Institutions. The details of Adarsh Sanskrit Pathshalas and the Sanskrit institutions affiliated to the Sansthan are given at **Annexure E**.

Award of Scholarship

The Sansthan operates three scholarship schemes on behalf of Ministry of Education and Culture, Govt. of India. They are (i) National Scholarship for the students of Shastri and Acharya, (ii) Post Matric Scholarship and (iii) Research scholarship for students of traditional Sanskrit Pathshalas. While the scholarships for the second and the third years were renewed, 17 fresh scholarships were awarded to students of Vidyavaridhi during 1983-84.

The library of the Sansthan functions under the control of the performance unit. It consists of more than 5000 books ; in it are also preserved rare books like the critical edition of Mahabharata and Ramayana. This is used as a reference library for Academic and Examination Wings of the Sansthan.

Research and Publication Unit

The Research and Publication Unit is also headed by a Deputy Director. It is responsible for the coordination of research and publication work of the different Kendriya Sanskrit Vidyapeethas. It has also its own research and publication programme. It brings out a half yearly research journal called "Sanskrit Vimarsha". Eleven volumes have been brought out already which include the one brought out in the year under report. The Sansthan has also programmes for the publication of rare and out of print texts. Some 134 volumes have already come out. The following prominent publications were brought out during the year.

A research journal and a magazine named Shodh Prabha have also been brought out by Shri G. N. Jha Kendriya Sanskrit Vidyapeetha, Allahabad and Shri Lal Bahadur Shastri Kendriya Sanskrit Vidyapeetha, New Delhi respectively during the year under report.

All the publication proposals of the Sansthan as well as those of the Vidyapeethas are scrutinised by a publication Committee. The meeting of the Committee was held on 28th September 1983.

The Sansthan has also cooperated with the Blind Relief Society in the preparation of some Sanskrit texts in braille script. It also takes part in the book fair organised in and outside Delhi. On these occasions catalogues of publications were distributed to scholars and publishers. This has helped in promoting the sales of Sansthan publications.

Correspondence Course Unit

An independent Unit headed by a Deputy Director has also been set up in the Sansthan headquarters at Delhi. As the Sansthan places special emphasis on non-formal education, it imparts Sanskrit teaching through correspondence courses to students in India and abroad at two levels through the medium of Hindi and English. So far 11000 students have undergone this course. 24 Sanskrit learners were enrolled in correspondence course from foreign countries during the session from 1982 to 1984. During 1984 only 2 students from U.S.A. and Austria were enrolled. During the year under report, the total number of the students enrolled in correspondence courses were as follows :

An advisory committee for the correspondence course is constituted as and when required to guide the organisation and management of this course from the Sansthan headquarters office.

Examination Section

The Examination Section is headed by a Deputy Controller (Examination) with a three tier staffing pattern. It is mainly responsible for the evaluation of performance of students who take various examinations of the Sansthan. Various examinations such as Prathama to Acharya including Shiksha-Shastri, Shiksha Acharya and Vidyavaridhi are conducted by the Sansthan. In these examinations students both from the constituent Vidyapeethas as well as the affiliated institutions are admitted. These examinations are conducted in accordance with the guidelines provided by the Academic Council and the syllabus laid down for the purpose. Several sub-committees work under the direct supervision of the Examination Board to look into the individual items of examination.

In addition 965 students appeared at the first year of the school examination which were conducted locally. In accordance with the decision taken by the Academic Council of the Sansthan, the question papers for these examinations were provided by the Sansthan Head Quarters this year.

19 research scholars were awarded degree of Vidya-varidhi by the Sansthan during the year.

A Recognition Committee which considers the question seeking recognition of the examinations of the Sansthan by other Universities and the other examining

bodies on reciprocal basis has been set up. The organisations, institutions, Government of India, State Governments, Association of Indian Universities and different Universities which have accorded recognition to the Sansthan's examinations for the purpose of employment as well as admission to the higher courses of studies are indicated at Annexure-F.

Administration Section

The Administration Section is headed by a Deputy Director. It deals with general administration of the Sansthan and the Kendriya Sanskrit Vidyapeethas. Creation of posts, appointments and other establishments matters are dealt with by this section. Similarly purchase of land, stock, stores and other assets, financial control over the expenditure of the Vidyapeethas etc. are also managed by this wing.

Finance and Accounts Wing

This wing is headed by a Deputy Director and manages the financial matters of the Sansthan. The Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan is fully financed by the Ministry of Education. In addition, small income accrues from examination fees, correspondence course charges and the sale of books and publications. An amount of Rs. 164.63 lakhs was allotted by the Ministry as grant-in-aid during the year 1983-84, Rs. 75 lakhs under Plan and Rs. 89.63 lakhs under Non-Plan. These funds were fully utilised. A small amount was

carried over to the next financial year in order to meet the obligatory expenditure during the initial period pending receipt of fresh grant.

The Sansthan also receives an amount of Rs. 9.50 lakhs as grant-in-aid for the distribution of scholarships to students doing research, engaged in studies in traditional Pathshalas studying Shastri and Acharya and to students of post-matric classes studying Sanskrit. During the year an amount of Rs. 9.41 lakhs was distributed on these scholarships.

Vidyapeethas

Seven Kendriya Sanskrit Vidyapeethas are at present functioning under the auspices of the Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan. Each of these is headed by a Principal and has two wings, (i) Academic, comprising teaching and Research/ Publication and (ii) Administration and Accounts. The location of these Vidyapeethas are as under :

Courses of Study

All the Kendriya Sanskrit Vidyapeethas except Allahabad Vidyapeetha are imparting instructions up to the Acharya level and also promote courses for teacher training leading to the Shiksha Shastri and Shiksha Acharya degrees. The Shiksha Acharya course is available only in Shri Lal Bahadur Shastri Kendriya Sanskrit Vidyapeetha and Kendriya Sanskrit Vidyapeetha, Tirupati. Kendriya Sanskrit Vidyapeethas, at Puri and Jammu have a school section with the curriculum of studies revised on the pattern of 10+2+3.

The subjects of specialisation are Veda, Dharma Shashtra, Karam Kanda, Sahitya, Sarva Darsana, Sankhya Yoga, Vedanta, Nyaya, Jaina Darsana, Vyakarana, Jyotisa and Puranetihasa. Extra Curricular Activities

The main function of the Vidyapeetha is teaching and research. There is also provision for publication of journals and out-of-print and unpublished works. One of the regular features of the extracurricular activities of the Vidyapeethas is holding of Sharadiya Jnana Mahotsava at specific periods in the different Vidyapeethas. On this occasion, scholars from specialised fields of studies are invited to deliver lectures on different subjects. Each scholar is offered a purse of Rs. 1000/- with a shawl. Another extra curricular activity started during the year under report was annual youth festival of students of different Vidyapeethas. The first such festival was organised in Tirupati Vidyapeetha from 1st January to 3rd January, 1984 in which at least ten students from each of the Kendriya Sanskrit Vidyapeethas participated. The programmes/items included Samasya Puri, Antyakshari, Essay Writing and Shastra Charcha, etc.. Kendriya Sanskrit Vidyapeetha, Tirupati stood first in these competitions and won the shield of the youth festival.

Projects and Schemes

Apart from the assigned work done by the respective sections of the Sansthan, there are also some special projects in some defined areas initiated by the Academic Unit of the Sansthan, namely :

- Collection and Preservation of Manuscripts
- Documentation and

National Sanskrit Survey.

Compendia of Selection from Sanskrit Literature.

First two schemes are being operated in Allahabad Vidyapeetha which is specially meant for research and publication. A Project Officer has been appointed to supervise the schemes. Under the scheme of documentation a micro-film equipment has been purchased for the Vidyapeetha. The National Sanskrit Survey work has been transferred to the Sansthan's headquarters and preliminary work has since started.

Kosa Project

The compilation of different kosas are allotted to different Kendriya Sanskrit Vidyapeethas, which have expertise in those branches. The details are given below :

Sastra Chudamani Scheme

Under this scheme the aged traditional scholars have been appointed in Kendriya Sanskrit Vidyapeethas to give in-depth coaching to the young teachers and researchers of the Vidyapeethas. Nearly 30 such scholars are engaged in different Kendriya Sanskrit Vidyapeethas.

Research Journal

The Sansthan published a regular half-yearly research journal by the name of "Sanskrit Vimarsa".

Cultural Exchange

Sanskrit teachers are posted to foreign countries for teaching Sanskrit or foreign scholars are invited to learn Sanskrit in the different Kendriya Sanskrit Vidyapeethas. During the year under report a Sanskrit teacher was sent to Bulgaria. A delegation was also sent to Japan to participate in an International seminar at Tokyo.
