# 1. INTRODUCTION

## 1.1. Role and functions

Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan now functioning as Deemed University was established in October, 1970 as an autonomous organisation registered under the Societies Registration Act, 1860 (Act XXI of 1860) for the development and promotion of Samskrit all over the country. It is fully funded by Government of India since its inception. It functions as an apex body for the propagation and development of Samskrit and assists the Ministry of Human Resource Development in formulating and implementing various plans and schemes for the development of Samskrit studies. It has assumed the role of a nodal body for the effective implementation of various recommendations made by the Samskrit Commission set up by the Government of India, Ministry of Education in 1956 concerning the propagation and development of Samskrit language and education in all its aspects.

Keeping in consideration of Sansthan's high value works in the field of promotion and propagation of traditional samskrit education, outstanding publications of unpublished Samskrit texts, preservation and procurement of over 50,000 rare Samskrit manuscripts, Govt. of India has given it the status of Deemed University w.e.f. from 7th May, 2002. vide Notification No. F.9-28/2000-U.3 followed by U.G.C's. Notification No.F.6-31/2001(CPP-I) dated 13th June, 2002.

The major objectives of the Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan as indicated in the Memorandum of Association are to propagate, develop and encourage Samskrit learning and research and to serve as a central administrative and coordinating machinery for the management of all Campuses established or takeover.

Prof. Vempaty Kutumba Sastry is working as Director of Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan during the period under report.

## 1.2 Programmes and Activities

For the realisation of its objectives, the Sansthan has undertaken the following programmes and activities:-

- Establishment of Campuses in different States.
- Conducting teaching of Samskrit on traditional lines at Secondary, Under-graduate, Graduate, Post-graduate and research at Doctorate levels.
- Conducting teachers' training at graduate level i.e. Shiksha Shastri (B. Ed.).
- Conducting and Coordinating research work in various disciplines of Samskrit.
- Cooperating with other organisations in sponsoring joint projects of common interest.
- Establishment Samskrit libraries, manuscripts collection centres and also editing and publishing rare manuscripts and books of importance.

### 1.3 Teaching

Teaching is conducted from Prak Shastri to Acharya levels on the basis of syllabus drawn up by the Sansthan in its constituent Campuses.

Sanskrit institutions managed by voluntary organisations and affiliated to the Sansthan, also impart teaching with the same syllabus. In all the Campuses, there is a two year buffer course of plus-two level called Prak Shastri to facilitate students of modern system of Sanskrit education to join the traditional stream. In Puri and Jammu Campuses, there is also school level teaching, beginning from Prathama (Classes VI, VII and VIII), upto Purva Madhyama (IX and X) and Uttar Madhyama (XI and XII). Presently, Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan is administering ten Campuses.

### 1.4 Teachers' training

In the Campuses; teachers' training course of one academic year with emphasis on teaching practice, is conducted leading to the award of Shiksha Shastri Degree, which is equivalent to B.Ed. in Sanskrit.

### 1.5 Research

Ganga Nath Jha Campus, Allahabad is exclusively meant for carrying out research in selected branches. Facilities exist in all the Campuses for students to enrol themselves for research and on successful completion of it, the degree of *Vidyavaridhi*, which is equivalent to Ph.D., is awarded to them.

### 1.6 Publications

#### A. Research Journals

The Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan brings out two research journals, namely '*Sanskrit Vimarshah* and *Journal of the Ganganath Jha Campus, Allahabad*'. While the first journal is brought out by the Sansthan's Headquarters office, the other is published by Ganganath Jha Campus, Allahabad. In addition, a literary journal namely, '*Ushati*' is also published from the Ganganath Jha Campus, Allahabad.

#### B. Books

Sansthan publishes research based/unpublished text based books written/edited by eminent scholars of the country. During the year under report an important decision has been taken to commemorate the Sanskrit Year by launching a series of publications under the caption '*संस्कृतवर्षस्मृतिग्रन्थमाला*'. Under this series it is contemplated to publish three hundred titles consisting of unpublished manuscripts/Sanskrit translations/original works. 5 titles under this series are under print. It is also decided that Sansthan will publish the reprints of important old and out of print books, and, to make available to the scholars on lowest cost.

Ganga Nath Jha Campus of the Sansthan is dedicated for editing and publishing of rare manuscripts. During the period under report Vidyapeetha has published seven Books.

### 3. ORGANISATION AND ESTABLISHMENT

The General Body is the policy making body of the Sansthan and consists of 26 members particulars of whom are annexed as Annexure 'A'. The Shasi Parishad is the apex Governing Council and has ten members besides the Adhyaksha and Upadhyaksha. Shasi Parishad implements the policies laid down by the General Body. The composition of present Shasi Parishad is annexed hereto as Annexure 'B'.

The following Committees/Councils assist the Shasi Parishad in discharging its duties :-

1. Artha Samiti (Finance Committee)
2. Vidya Parishad (Academic Council)
3. Prakashan Samiti (Publication Board)
4. Shodha Samiti (Research Committee)
5. Pariksha Mandal (Examination Board)

The Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan functions through seven Sections :-

1. Academic Section
2. Research and Publication Section
3. Correspondence Course & Non Formal Samskrit Education Section
4. Examination Section
5. Administration Section
6. Finance Section
7. Scheme Section

Each of these Sections is headed by Deputy/Assistant Director/ Deputy Controller. All these officers assist the Vice Chancellor of the Sansthan, who is the Principal Executive Officer responsible for the execution of policies and programmes approved by the General Body and Shasi Parishad.

#### 3.1 ACADEMIC SECTION

This Unit is mainly responsible for laying down standards for academic performance, preparation of calendar of the academic programmes and designing the syllabi for various courses.

### 3.2 RESEARCH AND PUBLICATION SECTION

This Unit is concerned with coordination of Research and Publication activities of the constituent Campuses and of the Research and Publication programmes and projects of the Sansthan. It also deals with schemes such as financial assistance to produce Sanskrit Literature and bulk purchase of books.

### 3.3 CORRESPONDENCE COURSE AND NON FORMAL SAMSKRIT EDUCATION SECTION

This Unit is responsible for the organisation of Correspondence Courses. These courses are offered at two levels. And the section also organises 100 Non Formal Education Centers all over India, produces study material for Non Formal Samskrit Education.

Correspondence course offered :-

- i) Introductory Course in Samskrit  
Ist year (Hindi & English Medium)
- ii) Introductory Course in Samskrit 2nd year  
(Hindi & English Medium)

Non Formal Samskrit Education Offers five level self study material beginning from level one to five. Any section of society who loves samskrit learning can be benefitted by this programme.

### 3.4 EXAMINATION SECTION

The Examination Section organises Annual and Supplementary examinations for the following courses :

Prathama	(class VIII)
Purvamadyama	(class X)
Uttarmadyama	(class XII)
Park Shastri	(class XII)
Shastri	(B.A.)
Shiksha Shastri	(B.Ed.)
Acharya	(M.A.)

A competitive entrance test is being held for admission to Shiksha Shastri course by the Sansthan through Examination Section. It is known as Pre-Shiksha Shastri Test (PSST).

It also arranges evaluation of thesis and viva-voce examination for awarding research degree Vidyavaridhi (Ph.D.) to the students of Campuses and affiliated institutions.

### 3.5 ADMINISTRATION SECTION

The Administration Section deals with general administration of the Sansthan and its constituent Campuses. It also plans appointments, postings, transfers and other establishment matters. Control over Campuses is also one of the main responsibilities of the Section.

### 3.6 FINANCE SECTION

This Section is concerned with the preparation of budget, receipt and distribution of grants, financial management and preparation of annual accounts etc. It also manages provident funds and arranges for disbursement of scholarships awarded under the scheme of the scholarships.

### 3.7 SCHEME SECTION

This Section is responsible for proper implementation of different schemes like financial assistance to voluntary Samskrit organisations, appointments of shastra chudamani scholars, financial assistance for organising vocational courses in different Samskrit Pathashalas/Vidyalayas/Voluntary Samskrit Organisations/Universities. The section is also responsible to organise All India Elocution Contest of traditional Samskrit students.

The School Section from Prathama to Uttarmadyama is being run only in Puri and Jammu and Prak-Shastri, being a buffer course, is taught in all the Campuses except Ganganath Jha Campus, Allahabad.

B.Ed. programme is conducted only at Puri, Jammu, Guruvayoor, Jaipur, Lucknow and Sringeri.

#### 4. ACADEMIC SECTION

This Section is headed by Dr. Smt. Savita Pathak, Deputy Director (Academic). During the reporting year. It is running with the following staff:

This Section is concerned with the following activities :-

It is the chief organisor of the academic activities of the Sansthan and frames the syllabi for various courses.

Separate subject committees are constituted to frame syllabi of different subjects from Prathama to Acharya. This is referred to Board of Studies consituted as and when required for scrutiny.

However, as regards English, Hindi and modern subjects like History etc. at school level, the syllabi of the C.B.S.E. is adopted. As regards the syllabi for modern subjects, viz. Hindi and English for Shastri Classes, the syllabi of Delhi University is normally followed.

## 5. RESEARCH & PUBLICATION SECTION

The section is headed by Assistant Director (Research & Publication), Dr. Prakash Pandey (M.A. Sanskrit, Acharya Yogatantra, Ph.D.).

This branch is responsible for the co-ordination of Research and Publication work of the Headquarters Office and the Campuses.

Besides, it is also entrusted with the work of implementation of the following schemes transferred from the Ministry:-

1. Production of Sanskrit literature including News Papers and Journals.
2. Purchase of Sanskrit books including reprint of out of print rare books.
3. Purchase and publication of manuscripts.

During the year 2002-2003 meeting of the Grants-in-Aid committee of Sansthan was convened three times, in which several important proposals were approved under different schemes. An amount of Rs. 83-40 lakhs was incurred under the schemes.

The section has expanded during the reporting year and yielded place to a new shape that will run as Correspondence Course and Non Formal Sanskrit Education center. At present the center is headed by Dr. Lalit Kumar Tripathi, Reader-Vyakaran (Transferred from Lucknow Vidyapeetha) Coordinator : Sanskrit Swadhyaya Yojana National Coordinator : Non Formal Sanskrit Education. In addition to these Dr. Dharmendra Kumar Singheo and Shri Ratna Mohan Jha have joined as Research Assistants in March 2003 and started their work as Asstt. Coordinator for the Project of Sanskrit Swadhyaya Yojana and Non Formal Samskrit Education in this Department.

### Correspondence Course

Sansthan conducts Correspondence courses for learning Sanskrit language through Hindi and English medium for general learners of Sanskrit in India and abroad at two levels viz (a) Introductory course in Sanskrit Ist year and (b) Introductory course in Sanskrit IInd year. In 2002-03 about 700 students got registration in Correspondence Course.

### Sanskrit Swadhyaya Yojana

Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan has felt that it is its duty to bring out self-study material of Samskrit to meet the needs of people at a distance. A far reaching project of launching five-level Samskrit self-study programme is the result of the realisation of responsibility stated above. Thus Samskrit Svadhyaya Yojana came into existence. The first level material consisting of five books approximately running into 900 pages has already been placed in the market in January 2002. Aims of each level are defined as below :

**First Level** : At this level effort is made to make the students speak a few sentences which are useful in day to day context and also write Samskrit through Devanagari script. It takes care of elementary skill in learning Samskrit.

**Second Level** : At this level emphasis is given to make the students able to express all important ideas related to the world around and to improve his capacity to express slightly complicated expressions.

**Third Level** : At this level attention is paid to improve the language learning skills towards greater perfection and to lead them to understand simple literary material.

**Fourth Level** : At this level higher level learning is provided along with study of slightly higher level literary master pieces. Also attempt is made to make students to write literary Samskrit and idioms of literary expression.

**Fifth Level** : Attempt is made to complete the abilities of students in understanding expressing and writing spoken as well as literary Samskrit from all its aspects. Necessary grammatical inputs have also been clarified at this level. A student is expected to be completely equipped to understand the Sanmskrit literature and other books with the help of commentaries at the end of this level.

■ Under this Project the Sankhepa-Ramayanam was prepared as a text suitable for self study with innovative exercises, edited and published in 2002-2003.

■ Structure of Second Level Course under Sanskrit Swadhyaya Yojana was designed and primary writing of study material of same has been completed.

■ The Introductory Course and it's structure of Phalita Jyotisha, Siddhanta Jyotisha and Vastushastra have been prepared.

■ The structure of third level course has been designed and some chapters of this course have been written primarily.

■ Five thousand (5000) copies of First Level have been re-printed with some modification and correction.

■ Four workshops have been organised under this project.

### NON-FORMAL SANSKRIT EDUCATION CENTRES

Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan was accorded sanction to conduct Non-Formal Sanskrit Education Centres in a quarterly cycle on experimental basis throughout the country during the year 2003.

People from all castes and communities of the society evinced great zeal for learning Sanskrit. Letters of counsel, post cards, inland letters and telephonic messages sent by the students reveal their inner feelings.

Different centers of Non-Formal Sanskrit Education were inaugurated by the distinguished persons of the society. All the Centre Incharges, Centre coordinators and Sanskrit Teachers have extended their full cooperation in proper conduction of these centres. The institutions running these centres gave advertisements, new and informations in the leading newspapers of National level, local newspapers and magazines. Propagation and promulgation was undertaken through advertisement, banners and handbills also. Grand inauguration and valedictory functions were organised at centres.

Study material of Prathama Diksha was the main base of the study materials at the centres. Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan has Prepared and published this material. This material was made available to the students at cost price. Certificates of participation were awarded at the end of the Prathama Diksha to those students who had either attended minimum 75% of their classes or who had passed the examination conducted by the their local centres. At the end of Prathama Diksha, Sansthan had invited letters of Counsel from the students regarding study material. Students have regarded the study material as excellent from the point of view of sequence, approachability, diversity of exercises and teaching methodology.

Along with the study of quarterly course, various cultural programmes and competitions were also organised at different centres.

These Non-Formal Sanskrit Education centres were not only conducted in cities and metropolitan cities of the countries, but they were also conducted in remote small villages, small towns. Sanskrit teachers had to come from far-off places also. The results are very pleasant and thrilling.

Non-Formal Sanskrit Education Centres were conducted in Universities, Colleges (Degree Colleges), Inter Colleges, High and Higher Secondary Schools, Junior High Schools, Public Schools and Volunteer Organisations throughout the country.

Thousands of learners not only evinced their positive liking for the ensuing studies through these centres, but they have also suggested for the conduction of shortterms courses of different disciplines of Sanskrit, such as Astrology, Philosophy, Karmakanda (the cult of religious rituals), Mythology etc. Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan is therefore, Making all endeavour for implementing this programme in future also.

Through this programme Sansthan could reach for away distances and expand its base for growth.

## 7. EXAMINATION SECTION

The Administration Section in the Headquarters Office of the Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan is performing its functions of house-keeping in accordance with rules, regulations and procedure. The Section is responsible for consolidation of accounts received from the various units of the Sansthan and submission to DGACR for audit. The consolidated accounts for the year 2002-2003 were submitted to DGACR for audit on 18.9.2003.

## **Maintenance of Provident Fund Accounts**

The Section maintains pay and provident fund accounts for officers and members of the staff of the Headquarters' Office. Every member has been supplied with the annual provident fund account statement immediately after the close of the financial year.

## **Pursuit of Audit Objections**

Concerted efforts were made during the year to get the audit objections settled. For this purpose, the individual Campuses were directed to take necessary corrective measures and replies of compliance were sent to the audit authorities with the result that a number of audit objections were got settled during the year.

The Section has also been entrusted with the work relating to Adarsh Samskrit Mahavidyalayas and release of Monetary grant to Scholars awarded certificate of honour by the President of India for their outstanding contribution to the languages Sanskrit, Pali, Prakrit, Arabic and Persian.

The Sansthan is implementing following schemes transferred by the Ministry of Human Resource Development, Government of India for promotion and propagation of Samskrit language and literature.

### (i) Financial Assistance to Voluntary Samskrit Organisations:

Under this scheme, selected organisations are sanctioned for financial assistance in shape of salary to Samskrit teachers, scholarship to students, Library grants and construction of the institution building.

An amount of Rs. 372 lakhs was incurred under this scheme by the Sansthan for the year 2002-2003. During the year, financial assistance was provided to 745 institutions.

### (ii) All India Elocution Contest

The Sansthan organises an All India Elocution Contest every year in different parts of the country to encourage traditional Samskrit students in extempore speech in Shastraic Sanskrit language. Competitions of SAMASYAPURTI are also organised. Each State Govt./ Union Territory Govt. is requested to send the names of eight participants alongwith one teacher for the contest in eight Shastraic subjects. The best contestant in every event is awarded a medal & certificate alongwith cash prizes of Rs. 800/-, Rs. 500/- and Rs. 300/- in order of merit i.e. 1st, 2nd and 3rd respectively. In addition to these prizes medals are also awarded amongst the winners. The prize money for SHLOKANTYAKSHARI is revised to Rs. 3000/-, Rs. 2000/- and Rs. 1000/- as 1st, 2nd and 3rd prize during the period under report.

In addition to existing ten events the "Shastra Shalaka Pariksha" has also been introduced during the year (2002-2003). The "Shastra Shalaka Pariksha" is to be conducted in the following three texts as announced during last year competitions at Sringeri.

1. Vyakarana

Dashagani from Vaiyakarana Siddhanta Kaumudi.

2. Nyaya

**Tarka-Sangraha-Deepika with Prakashika commentary of Neelakantha**

3. Kavya

The First six cantos of **Kumarasambhava**

The nature of the contest is taken from ancient tradition of Shastra Shikshan Paddhati of India where student has to have the whole text with its commentary in his memory and is expected to narrate and explain from the point revealed by a "Rajat Shalaka". The aim of this tough contest is to revive the tradition as well as to sharpen memory of student.

**The contest has three parts :**

1. **Kantha-Path Parikshanam** : The contestant has to narrate the lines of the given text by his memory till satisfaction of Experts

2. **Vyakhyan Parikshanam** : The contestant has to explain without seeing the text revealed till satisfaction of Experts

3. **Prashna Samadhanam** : The contestant has to answer any type of questions related with the revealed portion of the text by The **Shalaka**. Qualifying mark is 50% to have place in merit

Thus **Shalaka** has to reveal the book nine times for each contestant.

One sharpminded participant in each of the subject (Total Three) is allowed from each State exclusively for this event.

Medals, Certificates along with an amount of Rs. 3000/-, Rs. 2000/- and Rs. 1000/- is given as prize for 1st, 2nd and 3rd place winners in each subject respectively.

**(iii) Shastra Chudamani Scheme**

Under this Scheme, the services of retired eminent Samskrit scholars are utilised in Adarsh Samskrit Pathshalas and other State Government-run Samskrit Colleges/ Universities and voluntary organisations.

The object of the Scheme is to preserve the indepth studies of different Shastras at the various centres where Samskrit education is imparted to the Samskrit students of traditional system. As per the scheme, the traditional scholars are appointed in the different organisations. A sum of Rs. 30 lakhs was provided in the budget for this purpose. The scholars are being paid Rs.2500/ p.m. for a period of two years. The appointment so made may be extended for another one year as per the recommendation of the Grants-in-aid Committee.

**(iv) Vocational Training Scheme**

Under this scheme, selected organisations are sanctioned financial assistance to organise the workshop and to conduct prayogik Prashikshan in vocational disciplines like Jyotish, Karmakanda, Paleography, Cataloguing, Manuscriptology, Samskrit shorthand and Typing etc. An amount of Rs. 2.00 lakhs (2002-03) was provided under this scheme.

(v) **Adarsh Samskrit Mahavidyalaya/Shodh Sansthan**

Under this scheme 23 institutions are ring run in various parts of the country under the Sansthan. Such institutions are provided 95% of grant on recurring and 75% of grant on non-recurring items of expenditure. An amount of Rs. 228.11 lakhs under Plan and Rs. 224.98 lakhs under Non-Plan provided by the Sansthan to these institutions during the period under report.

(vi) **Sanskrit Dictionary Project:**

The project to prepare an encyclopadic Sanskrit Dictionary on historical principles spanning the period from 1500 B.C. upto 1900 A.D. has been undertaken by Deccan College, Poona. The project was started in the year 1948. The Department of Sanskrit Dictionary Project, Deccan College, Poona is headed by the General Editor and so far the project has brought out 6 volumes (five volumes in three parts each and part one of volume six) comprising 3048 printed pages of the dictionary. The work is in progress. The project was primarily financed by Govt. of India and to some extent by Govt. of Maharashtra. During the year 2002-2003 a sum of Rs.25 lakhs was sanctioned to Sanskrit Dictionary Project by the Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan.

(vii) **Monetary grant to Scholars awarded CERTIFICATE OF HONOUR by the President of India**

The Sansthan is releasing monetary grant to the tune of Rs. 50,000/- p.a. to the Scholars who have been awarded Certificate of Honour by the President of India.

A sum of Rs. 128.72 Lacks was incurred on this account during the year under report.

## 11. CAMPUSES

### 11.1 RASHTRIYA SANSKRIT SANSTHAN (DEEMED UNIVERSITY) SHRI GANGANATH JHA CAMPUS, ALLAHABAD (U.P.)

Allahabad campus is a Research Institute which is a part of the Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan. The campus admits every year a certain number of research scholars to carry out research work for the Ph.D. (Vidyavaridhi) Degree of the Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan. The scholars, thus enrolled, work under the guidance of one of the members of the academic staff of the Vidyapeetha utilising the facilities available in the Library of the campus as well as in its Manuscripts Section. The use of the Library and the manuscripts is not limited to the staff and the scholars of the Vidyapeetha but open to all scholars as reference library. The campus is a recognized research centre. The campus invites scholars and researchers interested in Sanskrit and ancient Indian Culture from all walks of life to make use of its Library subject to its capacity.

All the members of the Academic staff, besides guiding the research work of the students, pursue their own research work assigned to them by the Sansthan. The Research projects of the campus are carried out not only individually but also as team work.

Shri Raghunath Samskrit Mahavidyalaya established by Shri Ranbir Singh, the former Ruler of the J & K was taken over as Shri Ranbir Kendriya Sanskrit Vidyapeetha on 1st April, 1971. Students from Prathama to Acharya are taught here in Sahitya, Nyaya, Vyakarana, Phalit Jyotisha and Sarva Darshan. Shiksha Shastri was started in 1979 for the training of Samskrit Teachers. 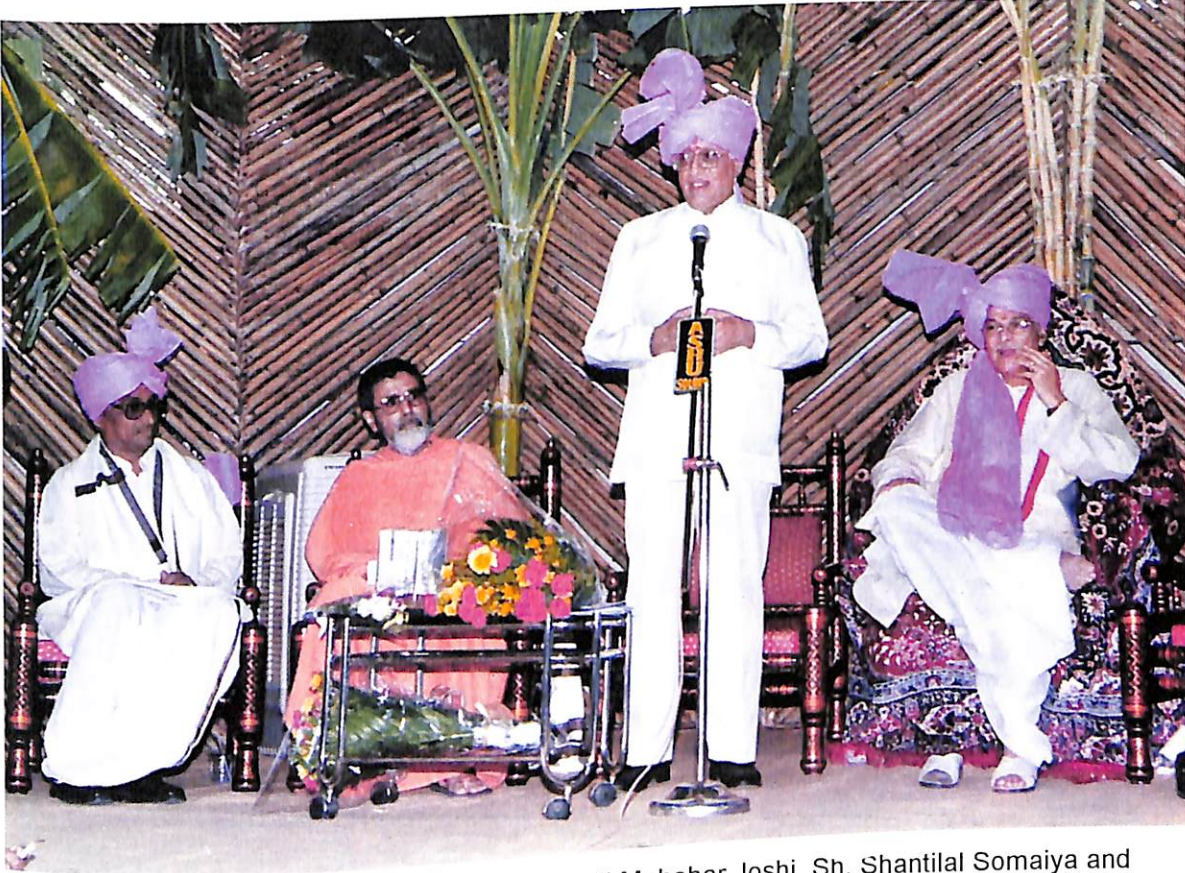

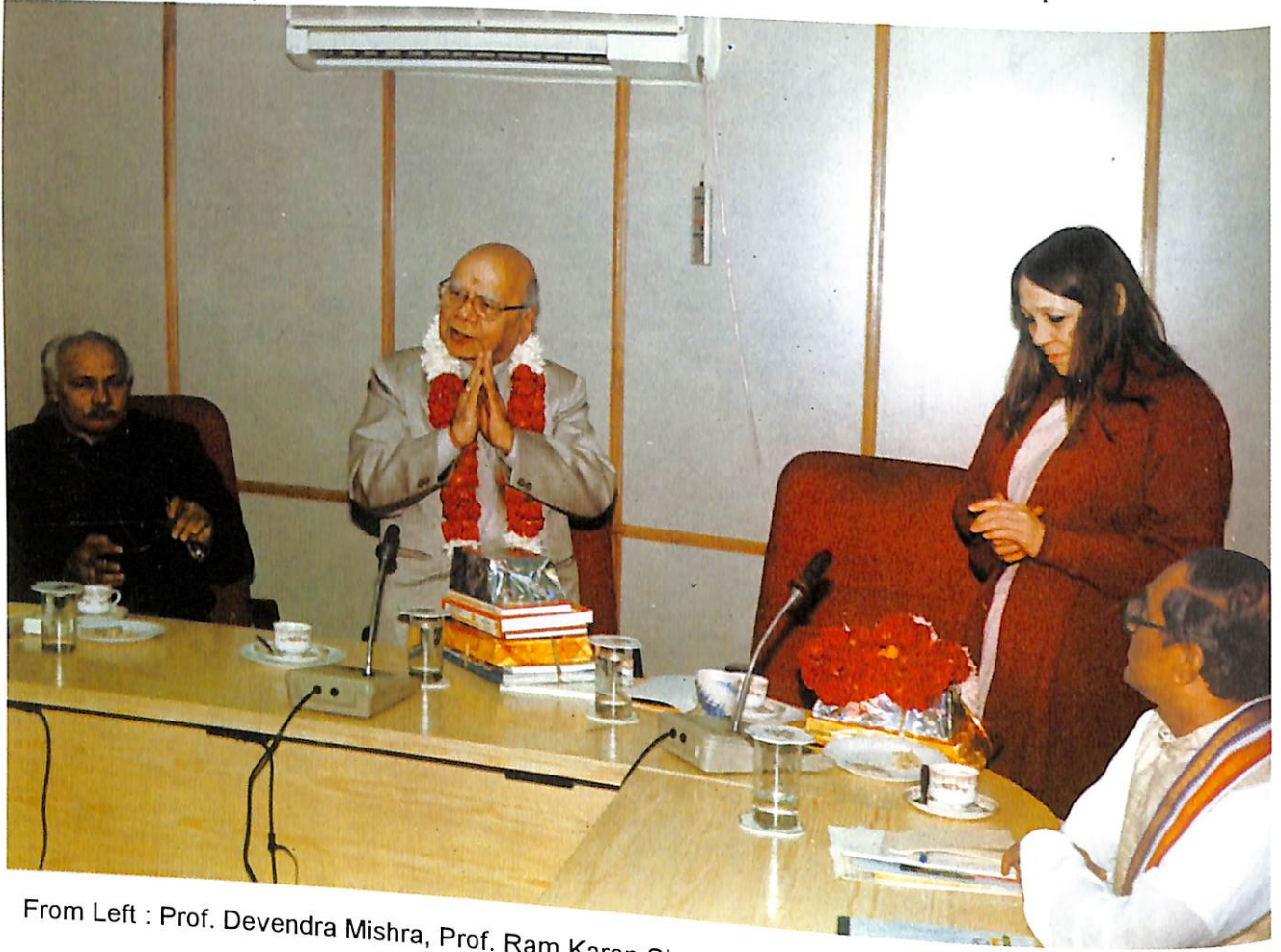
