I N T R O D U C T I O N

Role and Functions

The Sansthan was established in 1970 on the recommendations of the Kendriya Sanskrit Parishad as an autonomous organisation, registered under the Societies Act XXI of 1860 for the development and promotion of Sanskrit in the country. It functions as an apex body for the propagation and development of Sanskrit and assists the Ministry of Human Resource Development in the formation of various plans and schemes for the development of Sanskrit studies. It has also assumed the role for effective implementation of various recommendations made by the Sanskrit commission set up by the Govt. of India, Ministry of Education, in 1956 for propagation and development of Sanskrit language and education in all its aspects.

The major objectives of the Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan as indicated in the Memorandum of Association are to propagate, develop and encourage Sanskrit learning and research and to serve as a central administrative and coordinating machinery for the management of all the Kendriya Sanskrit Vidyapeethas established or taken over.

Programmes and Activities

For the realisation of the objectives, the Sansthan undertakes the following programmes and activities:

Conducts teaching of Sanskrit on traditional lines at Secondary, Under-graduate, Graduate, Post-Graduate and Doctorate levels.

Conducts, teachers' training at graduate and post-graduate levels.

Conducts examinations at Secondary, Graduation and post-graduation levels.

Conducts and coordinates research work in various disciplines of Sanskrit learning.

Cooperates with other organisations in sponsoring joint projects of common interest.

Builds up Sanskrit libraries and manuscripts collections; edits and publishes rare manuscripts and books of importance.

Functions as the Indian branch of the International Association of Sanskrit Studies and implements cultural exchange programme with Centres of Indology and Sanskrit studies abroad.

Teaching:

Teaching is conducted at Shastri and Acharya levels on the basis of syllabus drawn up by the Sansthan in seven of the eight Vidyapeethas, which are constituents of the Sansthan. Sanskrit institutions, managed by voluntary organisations and affiliated to the Sansthan, also impart teaching with the same syllabus. In all the Vidyapeethas there is a two-year buffer course of plus two level called Prak-Shastri to facilitate students who come from non-traditional streams to fit in the traditional system of Sanskrit education adopted by the Sansthan.

In addition, in two of the Vidyapeethas, secondary level teaching on the 10+2 pattern is also undertaken. These classes act as feeder for our degree classes.

Teachers' Training:

In seven of the eight Vidyapeethas, teachers training of one year's duration with emphasis on practical training, is conducted, leading to the award of Shiksha Shastri Degree, which is equivalent to B.Ed. In two Vidyapeethas at Delhi & Tirupati teacher's training at Post-graduate level, leading to the award of Shikshacharya degree, equivalent to M.Ed. is also conducted.

Research:

One of the eight Vidyapeethas is exclusively meant for carrying out research in selected branches. Facilities exist in all the Vidyapeethas for students to enrol themselves for research, on successful completion of which the degree of Vidyavaridhi, which is equivalent to Ph.D, is awarded to them.

Publications

The Reshtriya Sanskrit Sansthan brings out three prestigious journals, namely 'Sanskrit Vimaraha, 'Sadha Prabha and 'Ganga Natha Jha Research Journal'. While the first journal is brought out by the Sansthan Headquarter office, the other two are published by the Lal Bahadur Shastri Kendriya Sanskrit Vidyapeetha, New Delhi and Ganga Nath Jha Kendriya Sanskrit Vidyapeetha, Allahabad, respectively. In addition, publication of rare manuscripts with commentaries is also undertaken in a phased programme.

Cultural Exchange and Collaboration:

In accordance with the provisions of the cultural exchange agreements entered into by the Govt. of India, with foreign countries the Sansthan sends Sanskrit Scholars to various centres of Sanskrit studies abroad and receives scholars from these places. In addition, the Sansthan also takes active part in the international conferences and seminars. The Sansthan also collaborates with such international organisations whose objectives are similar to those of the Sansthan.

Structure and Administration:

The General Body is the policy making body of the Sansthan. The members of the General Body of the Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan are indicated at Annexure-'A'.

The Shasi Parishad is the Executive Body of the Sansthan. In addition to Adhyaksha and Upadhyaksha there are five other members including the Financial Adviser of the Ministry of Education and the Deputy Educational Adviser (Skt.) as Ex-Officio members. The composition of the Shasi Parishad for the year is given in Annexure-'B'.

The Shasi Parishad is assisted by the following committees.

- i) Artha Samiti
- ii) Vidya Parishad

The Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan functions through four sections: Academic, Examination, Administration, and Finance. The Academic Section consists of three branches, viz. Academic Branch, Research and Publication Branch and Correspondence course Branch. Each of these branches is headed by a Dy. Director. The Examination Section is headed by Dy. Controller of Examination. This branch has in addition an intermediary officer of the rank of Assistant Director. All these officers assist the Director of the Sansthan, who is the Principal Executive Officer responsible for the execution of policies and programmes approved by the General Body.

The Director of the Sansthan is appointed by the Government of India. During this year, Dr. Mandan Mishra, worked as Director.

Academic Section:

The Unit headed by Dr. Madhusudan Misra is mainly responsible for having standards for academic performance, preparation of calendar of the academic programme and for designing the syllabi for various courses. In addition, it also concerns itself with the work of affiliation of institutions and award of scholarships

Research & Publication Unit:

The Unit headed by Sh. A. Sampathnarayanan is concerned with implementation and coordination of Research and Publication activities of the constituent Vidyapeeths and of the Research and Publication programmes and projects of the Sansthan.

Correspondence Course Unit:

The Unit headed by Dr. K.N. Tiwari is responsible for the organisation of correspondence course. These courses are offered at two levels, viz.

- i) Introductory Course in Sanskrit
1st year (Hindi & English medium)
- ii) Introductory Course in Sanskrit
2nd year (Hindi & English medium)

Examination Section:

The Examination Section is headed by Sh. M.L. Sharma, and Assisted by Sh. S.C. Pant. The section organises Annual and Supplementary examinations for the following courses.

- Prathama
- Purvamedhyama
- Uttarmadhyama
- Prak-Shastri
- Shastri
- Acharya
- Shiksha Shastri
- Shiksha Acharya

It also arranges evaluation of these and Vive-voce examination for awarding research degrees to the students of Kendriya Sanskrit Vidyapeethas and affiliated research institutions.

Administration Section

The Administration Section headed by Sh. K.B. Chaube, deals with general administration of the Sansthan and its constituent Vidyapeethas. The staffing, appointments and other establishment matters and controls over Vidyapeethas are the main responsibilities of this section.

Finance and Accounts Section:

This section headed by Sh. T.N. Dhar, is concerned with the preparation of budget, receipt and distribution of grants, financial management and preparation of annual accounts, etc. It also manages provident funds and arranges for disbursement of scholarships awarded under the scheme of the Ministry of Education.

Vidyapeethas:

The Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan has so far established Eight Kendriya Sanskrit Vidyapeethas. Their location are indicated below:-

ACADEMIC SECTION

As already remarked in the Introductory Chapter, this section is headed by a Dy. Director. During the year under report, it is running with the following staff:

1. One Section Officer
2. One Assistant
3. One U.D.C.
4. One L.D.C.
5. One Class IV

The Section Officer also looks after the Research and Publication unit as far as the administrative and financial aspects are concerned.

This section is concerned with the following activities.

a) This Section is the Chief organiser of the academic activities of the Sansthan, and the framing of syllabus for various courses is the main activity from which all activities start and on which everything hinges.

Separate subjects committees in respect of Sanskrit are constituted on ad-hoc basis to frame the syllabus of Sanskrit subject from Prathama to Acharya. This is given to Board of studies constituted as and when required on ad-hoc basis for scrutiny. However, as regards, English, Hindi and Modern subjects like History etc., the syllabus of the C.B.S.E. meant for Central Schools are adopted. As regards the syllabus for the regional languages, the syllabus of the State Board are followed. As regards the syllabus for modern subjects Hindi & English at Shastri Level the main State University is followed.

During the year under report the syllabus printed during 1985-86 were slightly modified for 1987 Annual Examination.

b) Scholarship

The scholarship unit has two main branches. One is internal connected with the award of scholarships to the Vidyapeetha students. This is done within the budget provision of each Vidyapeetha. The following is the breakdown of the award during 1986-87.

d) Affiliation of Institution

The Sansthan had started with a few Kendriya Sanskrit Vidyapeethas and later a few private institutions were affiliated. These private institutions have been increasing in number. The Institutions affiliated to the Sansthan are placed at Annexure-'C'.

These private institutions are affiliated only for the general course from Prathama to Acharya. The affiliation for vocational courses like Shiksha Shastri and Shikshacharya had been stopped and is restricted to the Kendriya Sanskrit Vidyapeethas.

e) Shastra Chudamani

Experience and retired teachers in traditional learning are appointed in the Kendriya Sanskrit Vidyapeetha to give in depth training to the teachers of the Vidyapeethas and to the Research Scholars working there. RESEARCH AND PUBLICATION UNIT

The Research and Publication Unit is headed by a Dy. Director, During the year under report it is running with the following staff:-

3. One L.D.C.

It is responsible for the coordination of Research and Publication work of the Headquarters office and the Kendriya Sanskrit Vidyapeetha. During the year 1986-87 two meetings of the Research Committee were held. In these meetings 154 Research Committee were registered for Vidyavaridhi. It includes two scholars from the Kuppuswami Shastri Research Institute which has been affiliated for Vidyavaridhi. Vidyavaridhi Degrees were awarded to 18 scholars during the year under report.

A pre-research course of 6 weeks duration was conducted at Delhi Vidyapeetha for Research Scholars. About 100 scholars of different Vidyapeetha attended this course. Many prominent scholars had been invited to deliver lectures on various topics of research. They guided the students in Research Methodology. The lectures have been collected and are going to be published in the form of a book in its Sanskrit version.

The Publication Committee of the Sansthan met once during the year under report. The committee approved 22 titles for publication by the Headquarter office, and the Vidyapeetha.

The fourteenth volume of Sansthan's Half Yearly Research Journal, 'Sanskritvimarsha' No. 14 was brought out during the year under report. The Delhi and Allahabad Vidyapeethas have also shown progress in bringing out Research Journals entitled 'Sodhaprabha' and G.N. Jha Research Journal respectively. The Sansthan has taken up a project of compilation of 'Who is Who' of prominent traditional scholars of the country with the collaboration of Ford Foundation. Questionnaires for collection of data of scholars have been sent to the persons appointed region wise. The work of the project is in progress.

The Sansthan has also taken up the projects of Tape Recording of oral sastric tradition through Tirupati Vidyapeetha. It is also in collaboration with the Ford Foundation. During the year under report 38 Mimamsa topics were recorded in about 48 hours recording. Prominent traditional scholars were invited for recording different topics.

This unit of Research & Publication is also in charge of the Library which is running with an Asstt. Librarian and a Class IV employee. The Library has been arranged and fresh cards have been made.

CORRESPONDENCE COURSE

The Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan has established a separate Unit under the Academic Section exclusively for Sanskrit teaching through correspondence. For more than 10 years this section has been organising Sanskrit language teaching at preliminary stage through correspondence in both English and Hindi mediums. This course is divided into two levels of 21 lessons each and is covered through Correspondence in a maximum period of two years. Two lessons are despatched to the registered students every month and students, after grasping the lesson, are expected to answer the question given in the response sheet at the end of each lesson. The response sheet are returned by students to the Headquarter office of the Sansthan where they are evaluated by the evaluators, and the corrected response sheet are returned to the students for their guidance.

During the year 1986 i.e. from January to December, 1986 1084 students were registered for these two courses as per details given below:-

This course is being organised free of cost but, in order to ensure that only genuine students are enrolled a token annual fee of Rs.15/- per student in India and US\$ 10 per students abroad is charged from the aspirants.

In order to make these courses more popular and to enable a large number of aspirants to avail of this facility, a number of steps were taken by the Sansthan; a wide publicity was made in English and vernacular press through the Directorate of Audiovisual Publicity, letters were addressed to foreign Embassies and Consulates in Delhi and to Vice-Chancellor of the Universities in India, and so on. As a result of these efforts, in addition to young students, a number of high ranking officers and people in various vocations have registered their names with the Sansthan and are learning Sanskrit through the correspondence course.

These who complete these courses successfully get a certificate entitled 'Sanskrit Praveshha'.

EXAMINATION SECTIONEXAMINATION SECTION

At the end of every academic year, in the month of April, the Sansthan holds public examinations for the final year of Prathama and for each year Purvamadyama, Uttarmadyama, Prak-Shastri, Shastri and Acharya and for the teachers training courses leading to Shiksha Shastri and Shikshacharya (B.Ed.) and M.Ed.) degrees.

This section is headed by a Dy. Director. During the year under report, it was running with following staff:

The Administration Section in the Headquarter office of the Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan performs its functions of house keeping in accordance with rules, regulations and pro-cedure. It provides the necessary support to the various constituent Vidyapeethas of the Sansthan for their effective and efficient functioning. This mainly deals with general administration, establishment matters, services & supplies and acquisition of land & building, establishment of new Kendriya Sanskrit Vidyapeethas and conducting meetings of Shasi Parishad and General Body of the Sansthan.

During the year under report 5 new posts of P.T.Is Technical Laboratory Assistant and Group 'D' were created. In addition, actions were taken for selections of Principal Readers, Lecturers and P.T.Is. to fill up about 80 vacancie of these posts. The meeting of the Departmental Promotion Comm ttees were also held to fill up the vacancies of Ministerial staff in Vidyapeethas as well as in the Head-quarter Office. A few cases of successful completion of

probation period and crossing of efficiency bar in respect of some Ministerials staff of the Headquarter office were considered by the Standing Departmental Promotion Committee during the year.

Efforts have been made to acquire land and for the construction of buildings for those Vidyapeethas, which are not having their own building. In this connection, a piece of land has been acquired at Bhailwal with the assistance of State Govt. of J&K for construction of building of Sh. Ranbir Kendriya Sanskrit Vidyapeetha, Jammu. Action for construction of boundary wall on this land is under process. The State Govt. of Orissa has also allotted a piece of land at Bhuvaneshwar for construction of building of our Puri Vidyapeetha. Action for registration of the land in the name of the Vidyapeetha is under process. Action for construction of building will be taken immediately after the registration of the land. Similar action is also being taken in respect of Jaipur and Lucknow Vidyapeetha, where the respective State Govt. have already allotted land for construction of building.

At present there are 8 Constituent Vidyapeethas under the Sansthan. In addition it has been decided to establish one new Kendriya Sanskrit Vidyapeetha at Calcutta in West Bengal. A piece of land measuring 1.79 acre has already been acquired with the assistance of the State Govt. for construction of building of the Vidyapeetha. The Vidyapeetha is likely to start functioning very soon.

FINANCE & ACCOUNTS SECTION

This section is headed by the Dy. Director (Finance) and comprises one Section Officer, One Assistant, One U.D.C. and four L.D.Cs. The following are the main activities of the Section:-

- a) Obtaining Budget Estimates from the constituent Vidyapeethas and preparation of consolidated budget estimates for the Sansthan as a whole and getting it approved by the Ministry of Human Resource Development.
- b) Preparation of annual accounts for the Headquarters office and consolidated annual accounts for the Sansthan and its constituent Vidyapeethas. After getting these accounts audited and certified by the Director of Audit Central Revenues submission of the account to the Ministry for being laid on the table of the Parliament.
- c) Control of expenditure: for this purpose periodical expenditure statement are obtained from the Vidyapeethas.
- d) Preparation of pay bills, medical bills and bills relating to various advances like Festival Advance, House Building Advance etc.
- e) Issue of sanction relating to advances for purchase of conveyance, advances from provident funds accounts, final withdrawals etc.

f) Maintenance of cash book, ledger accounts, Register of various advances, PBR, fund broad sheets and personal accounts files relating to the staff in the Headquarter office

g) Scrutiny of purchases and rent bills received from Admn. Section, purchase of books and printing bills received from Academic Section, remuneration bills received from Examination Section & C.C. Section.

h) Control of imprest granted for purchase of stamp to Administration, Examination, Academic & C.C. Sections.

i) Receipt of Audit Report from various Accounts General and Director of Audit, their persuit and settlement of Audit objection in consultation with the Principals of the Widyapeethas.

B U D G E T

An unspent balance of Rs.29.14 lakhs was carried over from the year 1985-86 to the current financial year 1986-87. A total budget of Rs.263.48 lakhs (including the previous un-spent balance) was sanctioned by the Ministry. This was more than four times the amount sanctioned ten years back in 1976-77 (Rs.67.83) and more than twice the amount sanctioned five years back during 1981-82 (Rs.119.66). The amount was further allocated among the constituent Units in the following manner:-

These funds were utilised during the year on pay and allowances, scholarships and other maintenance items of expenditure. The expenditure on Jaipur and Lucknow Vidyapeethas was met from out of funds under plan and in addition special projects building activities and purchase of assets were financed from the plan funds, an unspent balance of Rs. was left over in order to meet the expenditure during the first few months of the following financial year till the grant in aid was received.

ACCOUNTS

The Sansthan was in arrears so far as preparation and submission of accounts was concerned. However, with a concerted efforts of the section we have been able to clear the back-log and the submission of accounts for the year 1985-86 only was in arrears. While the accounts of the constituent Vidyapeethas were audited and certified by the respective Accountant General during the year itself, there was some delay in the submission of the consolidated accounts

which have been audited during the subsequent year. The Audit Accounts for 1985-86 & 1986-87 have however since been submitted.

In order to avoid any delay, the following times table has been prescribed for the various stages of the preparation of annual accounts:-

- Compilation of accounts by the Vidyapeetha - 30th April.
- Submission of accounts to A.G.'s. - 1st week of May.
- Receipt of draft audit reports - 15th July
- Submission of replies - 31st July
- Receipt of certified accounts in the Headquarters. - 15th August.
- Consolidation & Submission to Audit - 15th Sept.
- Receipt of Draft Audit Report - 15th Oct.
- Receipt of certified account - 30th Nov.
- Submission after approval by Artha Samiti/Shasi Parishad - 31st Dec.

In addition, a meeting of the Section Officer (Accounts) of all the Vidyapeethas was convened at Headquarters office in the Month of May, 1987 in order to finalise the accounts for 1986-87. Audited Receipt & Payment Accounts are placed at Annexure-'D'.

MAINTAINANCE OF ACCOUNTS

The Section has maintained pay and provident fund accounts for - Officers and members of the staff of the Headquarters office. Every member was supplied with the annual provident fund accounts soon after the close of the financial year and their pay and allowances as also arrears were drawn in time. The revised pay scale for

Group 'B' 'C' & 'D' were adopted in the Sansthan with the approval of the Chairman and arrears accruing as a result of their adoption were also paid to these employees.

SCRUTINY OF BILLS

During the year a total number of 3064 bills were received from various Sections of the Headquarters office and payment of these bills was made after due scrutiny.

ISSUE OF SANCTIONS

During the financial year 1986-87 sanctions were issued authorising advances from provident funds, advances for purchases of conveyances, fan and advances on account of various festivals.

PURSUIT OF AUDIT OBJECTIONS

The concerted efforts was made during the year to get the audit objections settled. For this purpose, the individual Vidyapeeths were directed to make necessary corrective measures and replies of compliance were sent to the audit authorities with the result that a total number of 27 audit objections were got settled during the year.

SCHOLARSHIPS ON BEHALF OF THE MINISTRY

The Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan is operating two schemes of scholarships on behalf of the Ministry of Human Resource Development. The first scheme relates to payment of scholarships to the students prosecuting studies in Sanskrit at Post-Matric level and the second scheme covers

the students studying in traditional system leading to the award of degrees of Shastri, Acharya, and Vidyavaridhi. Under these schemes, an amount of Rs.9.50 lakhs was provided to the Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan out of which scholarships amounting to Rs.8.75 lakhs were distributed to various Universities leaving a small balance of Rs.75,255. The rate of scholarships for various classes is given below:-

Regional Vedic Sammelan

This is yet another scheme operated by the Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan on behalf of the Ministry of Human Resource Development. Under this scheme, five regional Vedic scholars of each region to assemble and exchange their ideas on various aspects of Vedic learning. During the year 1986-87, Regional Vedic Sammelans were held at Hardwar, Deogarh, Jaipur, Tirupati and Ahmedabad. In addition, one more Vedic Sammelan was held at Gauhati under the auspices of the Sanskrit Department of the University. The sammelan was actually scheduled to be held during the previous year but had to be postponed to the current year. The local organisers of these Vedic Sammelans were advanced a sum of Rs.30,000/- each for holding these Vedic Sammelans.

Deemed University Status to Tirupati
and Delhi Vidyapeetha.

In pursuance of the decision taken by the Ministry and the Shasi Parishad of the Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan to give 'Deemed to be University' status to Kendriya Sanskrit Vidyapeetha, Tirupati and Shri Lal Bahadur Shastri Kendriya Sanskrit Vidyapeetha, New Delhi. Memorandum of Association and rules for these two Vidyapeethas were drafted and got approved. Two new societies under the name of Rashtriya Sanskrit Vidyapeetha, Tirupati and Shri Lal Bahadur Shastri Rashtriya Sanskrit Vidyapeetha, New Delhi were got registered in December, 1986 and January 1987 respectively. List of Assets held by these two Vidyapeethas as on 31st March, 1987 has been drawn up and the approved by the Ministry for the transfer of these assets to the new societies has been solicited.

In 1961 the Kendriya Sanskrit Vidyapeetha Society was registered as an autonomous body under the Ministry of Education, Govt. of India. This Society was dissolved in 1970 when the Vidyapeetha was handed over to the Sansthan. Since then, it is running as a constituent unit of the Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan.

It has at present several departments, namely Pedagogy, Research and Publication, Acharya Wing, Library Manuscripts, Tape Recording and Mimamsa under oral Shastric tradition. It also undertakes other activities like elocution contest, extension lectures scouting, tour and first aid etc.

(II) SHRI LAL BAHADUR SHASTRI KENDRIYA
SANSKRIT VIDYAPEETHA, NEW DELHI

Introduction

This Vidyapeetha was established by the All India Sanskrit Sahitya Sammelan, on the Vijaya Dashami day of the year 1962 with a view to fulfil the following aims and needs for an International Sanskrit Institute in the capital of India.

1. To impart instructions in higher Sanskrit learning including neglected & highly specialised branches, with a view to preserving the traditional erudite Sanskrit learning.
2. To co-ordinate Sanskrit Studies.
3. To conduct research in Sanskrit pedagogy and provide for training of Sanskrit teachers.
4. To provide facilities for the study of such languages and literature of Asia as have a bearing on Sanskrit studies.
5. To bring out literature on Sanskrit, including translation concerning both ancient and modern knowledge.
6. To arrange publication of Research works and journals and aid to Research, such as indexes, digests and bibliographies.
7. To collect, preserve and publish manuscripts, to build up a National Sanskrit Library and a Sangrahalaya, having bearing on Sanskrit Studies, such as Srauta, Ayurveda, Yoga and Vastuvidya, and so on.
8. To provide facilities for Research in Sanskrit through traditional as well as modern methods.

9. To provide facilities for any other line of work for the development of Sanskrit learning.

The Vidyapeetha was fortunate to have the late Prime Minister Shri Lal Bahadur Shastri as its Founder President. During his stewardship it was registered under the name 'Akhil Bharatiya Sanskrit Vidyapeetha'.

The Vidyapeetha got a good lease of life under the inspiring guidance of late Shri Shastriji who took keen interest in the development of the Institution even while holding the august office of the Prime Minister. In the convocation address of Varanaseya Sanskrit Vishvavidyalaya, (26th December, 1964) and on 27th November, 1965 in the presence of late Maharejadhiraja Shri Mahendra of Nepal on the occasion of foundation stone laying ceremony of the Vidyapeetha, he declared his intention to make the Vidyapeetha an International Sanskrit Institute. He continued to be its Chairman till the last moments of his life and under his leadership this institution carved out an important place for its among the Sanskrit teaching institutions of this country in a short span of three years.

After his death, looking to the services of the Vidyapeetha and late Shastriji's historic association with it, the Prime Minister of India Smt. Indira Gandhi also accepted to be the Chairman of this Vidyapeetha. Late A.N.

Jha, then Lt. Governor of Delhi was the acting President and contributed a lot of its development. On 2nd October, 1966, as a mark of respect to the services of Shri Shastriji and to give it the patronage of the Govt. of India, Smt. Indira Gandhi declared to name it 'Shri Lal Bahadur Shastri Rashtriya Sanskrit Vidyapeetha.

The Government of India, Ministry of Education, took over the Vidyapeetha as an autonomous body with effect from 1st April, 1967 and constituted a committee for its management. At present this Vidyapeetha is working under the auspices of the Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan as an Institute of higher studies in Sanskrit.

From 1962 to 1968 the Vidyapeetha was affiliated to Shri Kameshwar Singh Darbhanga Sanskrit Vishwavidyalaya (Bihar) and followed its syllabi and scheme of examination in all the classes, i.e. Shastri, Shiksha Shastri and Acharya. During the year 1969-70, the Vidyapeetha, under the recommendation of the Ministry of Education, Govt. of India, was affiliated to the Varanaseya Sanskrit Vishwavidyalaya which very kindly arranged for the special courses of study for this Vidyapeetha and thus set a new precedent in the history of Sanskrit education.

From the year 1971, the Vidyapeetha has been following the syllabus of the Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan and prepares and guides students for obtaining the Prak-Shastri, Shastri Shiksha-Shastri Acharya, Shikshacharya, Vidyaveridhi (Ph.D.) Degree of the Sansthan.

.....

At present this Vidyapeetha is running in its own premises of eleven acre land, adjacent to Jawaharlal Nehru University Campus at Shahsed Jeet Singh Marg. There are fifty rooms in the building of the Vidyapeetha in which adequate arrangements have been made for several salient activities like Library, Reading Room, Research Cells and Seminar-Room. The Vidyapeetha has its own hostel furnished with all the modern amenities, with residential arrangements made for 96 students. It has also forty eight residential quarters for all categories of employees.

PRESENT ACTIVITIES

The Vidyapeetha has set before it the goal of emerging as an International centre for Sanskrit studies. However, for the present looking to the available means, the Vidyapeetha is conducting the following activities.

Faculty of Prachina Shastras

This faculty was started in the year 1962. At present teaching facilities are available for three years graduate and two years post-graduate courses in the following subjects: (1) Shukla Yajurveda (2) Dharmashastra (3) Karamkand, (4) Sarvedarshana (5) Sankhya Yoga (6) Advaita Vedanta (7) Prachina Nyaya Vaisheshika (8) Navya Nyaya (9) Prachina Vyakarana (10) Paurobitya (11) Navya Vyakarana (12) Sidhanta Jyotish (13) Phalita Jyotish (14) Puranetihasa and (15) Sahitya

On successful completion of these courses, Shastri and Acharya Degrees are awarded to the students. There is a special provision of two years Prak-Shastri course for those who have passed High School or equivalent examination without Sanskrit from a recognised examination Board. With a view to enrich the students with the modern scientific knowledge arrangements have been made for imparting instructions in modern studies like Political Science, Sociology Hindi, English, Physical Education etc.

This year 419 students were studying under the faculty details are given below:-

In the last examination held in 1985, the result of this faculty 73.7% in Prak-Shastri, 56% in Shastri and 71.5% in Acharya.

One Professor, 18 Readers, 7 Lectures and 2 Jr. Lecturers were working in this faculty during the year under reference.

Faculty of Education

This faculty was started in the year 1964 with a view to making trained Sanskrit teachers available to the country. This faculty conducts two training courses

each of one year duration at graduate and post-graduate levels. On successful completion of these courses, the students are awarded 'Shiksha-Shastri (B.Ed.) and Shiksha-Acharya(M.Ed.) degrees.

In Shiksha Shastri, besides, Educational Psychology, Educational Philosophy, School Management, Modern Educational Problems, Methods of teaching Sanskrit languages and Physiology the students are imparted training in some experimental lessons, art scouting and First-Aid also.

In Shikshacharya course, arrangements have been made to impart educational training at higher level. The students study philosophy of Education, Advanced Psychology, Educational Research Statistics, Vocational Educational Guidance, Educational Administration and Supervision, training to teachers, besides writing research dissertation on educational topics.

286 students were studying under this faculty in the current year.

One Professor, Eight Readers, and 5 Lecturers were working in this faculty during the year 1986-87.

As part of the curriculum, training in scout and first aid was imparted in the month of December, 1986 and September, October, 1986.

In the examination held in April/May, 1986 the the result of Shiksha Acharya was 85.7% and Shiksha Shastri 77%.

Faculty of Research & Publication

This faculty was started in the year 1964 keeping in view the importance of co-ordination of ancient Indian Philosophical thinking and Modern methodology of research. At present the following activities are being conducted under this faculty.

I(a) Research by Students

In this department students are registered for prosecuting work on various branches of Sanskrit learning like Veda, Purana, Darshana, Jyotisha, Agama, Karmakanda, Alamkarashastra, Sahitya, Vyakarana, History, editing of unpublished manuscripts and education. These students are awarded Vidyavaridhi Degree of Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan, after completion of their research work. As many as 90 students are working in this department.

Nine students submitted their thesis for the award of Vidyavaridhi degree during the year.

Two lecturers and 3 Research assistants were working in this faculty.

(b) Research Seminars

In order to boost up the research tendency of the students engaged in research work, this department organise a weekly seminar regularly, wherein the research scholars and teachers of the Vidyapeetha read papers and group discussion are held. Lectures of reputed scholars are also arranged from time to time.

2. Independent research projects undertaken by teachers of the Vidyapeetha and other reputed scholars.

Under this scheme, rare and obsolete texts of Sanskrit literature are critically edited or translated with commentaries thereon by reputed scholars of various branches of Sanskrit learning. Fifty such work have been published so far and work is in process on eight other texts.

3 (a) Departmental Research Work

The Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan has approved an extensive project of compiling a 'Dictionary of Indian Philosophy' for the research department of the Vidyapeetha. The project envisages the collection of references from traditional texts of all the systems of Indian philosophy. This work will be highly beneficial to those who are engaged in prosecuting research on Indian Philosophy.

At present the work on 'Sankhya Yoga Darshana' is going on. The first part has been completed and is ready to given to the press.

The editing work of 'Krishna-Yajurvediya Taittiriya Samhita (with Senana-Bhashya) alongwith Hindi translation and commentary by late M.M. Parameshvarananda Shastri (II Part) is being done by this department.

(b) Darshana-Kosha-Workshop

The department organises 'Darshana-Kosha-Workshops' from time to time with a view to getting the work evaluated and to obtain suggestions to be followed in the process of preparation of 'Bharatiya Darshana Kosha'. Extensive discussions are held by reputed Philosophers of the country in these workshops.

(c) Research Journal

A half yearly journal was started by this department as 'Adhyayanamala'. Now instead of Adhyayanamla, 'Sodha Prabha' a quarterly research journal, is regularly being published for the 1st eight years. This journal comprises research articles of the reputed scholars of the Vidyapeethas as well as from outside, ancient unpublished small works, lecturers delivered in the Sharadya Jnana Mahotsava and review of the newly published works. This year a special volume on Smt. Indira Gandhi was published.

(d) Publications

In order to bring forward the research works being presecuted under this department, a publication scheme is

going on since the inception of this Vidyapeetha.

Vidyapeetha Panchanga

With a view to giving all round training to the students doing research in the field of Jyotisha, Vidyapeetha has started to publish a Panchanga from the year 1982.83. An observatory has been established and it will be completed very soon.

Shastre Chudamani Project

The Vidyapeetha is running Shastre Chudamani Scheme for the last three years. Under this scheme, arrangements have been made to impart teaching facilities to such scholars as are interested in getting deep knowledge of a particular shastre. At present two eminent scholars are working in different subjects.

Sharadiya Jnana Mahotsava and Shastriya Vyakhyanamala

With a view to disseminating the knowledge concerning Indian Cultures and Sanskrit literature, the Vidyapeetha has been organising lecture series from its very beginning. These lectures are being organised from time to time under 'Sharadiya Jnana Mahotsava, Sri Lal Bahadur Shastri Smaraka Vyakhyanamala' and Vasanta Vyakhyanamala.

These lecture series have proved very useful for propagation of marvellous contents of our traditional Shastres. At the same time our great leaders and intellectuals are apprised of the activities of the Vidyapeethas with the help of these series.

On 15th August, 1971 the Former Sadasiva Sanskrit College, Puri functioning under the State Government with its long association with the study of Sanskrit in traditional form, was taken over by the Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan, New Delhi, an autonomous body functioning under the Ministry of Human Resource Development, Govt. of India to augment endeavour of Central Government for spreading and popularising Sanskrit study in common walk of life. The old Sadasiva Sanskrit College, Puri has been renamed as Shree Sadasiva Kendriya Sanskrit Vidyapeetha, Puri after its manggement has been taken over by the Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan, New Delhi. The newly born institution is trying persistently and ceaselessly to achieve the ultimate goal for which it has been established.

(IV) GANGA NATH JHA KENDRIYA SANSKRIT
VIDYAPEETHA, ALLAHABAD/

The G.N. Jha Kendriya Sanskrit Vidyapeetha was established in 1943 as Ganganath Jha Research Institute by the friends and well-wishers of Sir Ganganath Jha who was an exceptionally eminent scholar of Sanskrit and had adorned the Chair of the Vice-Chancellor of Allahabad University for three terms. The Research Institute inherited the rich library (Manuscript and printed works) of Sir Ganganath Jha as well as his sons. It was run by the recurring grants of the State Govt. as well as the Sanskrit cell of the Ministry of Education, Govt. of India. Its main aim in those days was to maintain a rich library of printed books as well as Mss. for scholars interested in Indological research. It also published a Research Journal of high repute which was exchanged with dozens of Oriental Journals published all over the world. In its limited means it also collected Mss. by way of purchase and donation and undertook the work of critically editing certain important texts.

The Institute was taken over by the Govt. of India, Ministry of Education in 1971 and was placed under the Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan as G.N. Jha Kendriya Sanskrit Vidyapeetha. It was decided in 1973 to continue it as an Institute of higher Sanskrit research and learning. This courses and admits students only for the degree of higher sanskrit research and learning. This Vidyapeetha consequently does not have any teaching courses and admits students only for the degree of

of Vidyavaridhi Degree (Ph.D.) of the Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan, The students work under one of the academic members of our staff. The academic members of the staff pursue their own approved research programmes which include preparation of critical edition of Sanskrit manuscripts, teaching material of Sanskrit and Laxice.

15 Students are usually admitted every year in the month of January out of which 12 receive research scholarships of the Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan which carries an emoluments of Rs.500/- per month plus a contingency grant of Rs.1,000/- every year. In the year under review (1986-87) the total number of students registered in our Vidyapeetha were 50, out of which 20 students were receiving scholarships, whereas 30 students had ceased to receive the scholarship but were pursuing their research work without any further financial grant. In all 34 these had been submitted to the Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan since 1977. Out of these 30 students had already received their degree and 4 these were still under consideration with the Sansthan. There is an average of submission of 3 to 4 thesis every year to the Sansthan and this year too 4 thesis were submitted by our students.

The Inter-Vidyapeetha Youth festival was celebrated this year with the grant fun-fair in this Vidyapeetha from 3rd to 6th February 1987 in which all the Vidyapeethas except Tirupati participated. The festival was inaugurated

by Prof. V. Venkatachalam, the Vice-Chancellor of Sanskrit University, Varanasi. The presence of hundreds of Sanskrit students from all over India in the campus of our Vidyapeetha for 4 days charged the whole atmosphere with Shastric learning and Sanskrit language. Excellent cultural programmes were presented by the troupes of different Vidyapeethas on the stage of Prayag Sangeet Samiti. The arrangements for lodging and boarding of the students were praised and appreciated by all.

There are presently around 50,000 printed volumes in our Library to which we may add some, 3000 volumes of journals as well. The Library was receiving 30 journals in exchange with our journal in this year and was receiving 42 other periodicals and magazines. 26 new periodicals were subscribed during 1986-87. We added about 500 new books to our stock in the year 1986-87. The attendance register kept in the Library shows that some 6000 Readers used the services of our Library during that year.

There are at present some 43,000 duly accessioned Mss. in our Manuscript Library. A number of Mss. procured and purchased during the current year under the Sansthan's scheme for Collection and Preservation of Manuscripts is 1,171. More than 60 valuable Mss. were chemically treated and preserved during this year. About, 1,000 cards were prepared giving detailed description of Mss. which shall be used in preparing the Descriptive Catalogue.

One of the major achievements of Mss. Department this year was to prepare Microfilm of certain rara works of Saiva Darsana deposited with the Research Department of Keshmir Govt. at Srinagar. Some 65 rolls were prepared by one of our Research Assistant which contain more than 20 works of Philosophy and Tantra. The task of getting photo-prints of these Mss. is underway.

The Vidyapeetha also has had the occasion of listening to the learned lectures and discourses of several scholars this year. We also got the privilege of welcoming His Holiness 108 Shri Shankaracharya of Kamakoti Peetha, Kanchipuram amidst ourself and to listen to his pious discourse.

Of the publications released this year, three deserve special mention, namely (1) The Voluminous Vol. 40 of our Journal (2) MRIDVIKA a Collection of Sanskrit lyrics by Dr. Jagannath Pathak and (3) The Vaikunthavijaya Campu, edited by Dr. E.K. Govindan.

A number of smaller pamphlets regarding the Vidyapeetha were also issued during the time of the inauguration of the Youth Festival.

(V) SHRI RANBIR KENDRIYA SANSKRIT
VI DYAPEETHA, JAMMU/

History

The erstwhile Shri Raghunath Sanskrit Mahavidyalaya established by the king, Shri Ranbir Singh of J & K was taken over as Shri Ranbir Kendriya Sanskrit Vidyapeetha on 1st April, 1971.

Students from Prathama to Acharya are taught here in Sahitya, Navya Vyakarana, Phalit Jyotisha and Sarva Darshana. Shiksha Shastri was started in 1979 for the training of Sanskrit Teachers. The modern subjects like Hindi, Dogri, English, Political Science and History are taught alongwith the traditional subjects up to the Shastri level.

The Kashmir Shaiv Darshan Project is running in this Vidyapeetha to compile a Dictionary of Kashmir Shaiv Darshan. The work is in progress and is expected to be completed within one and half years.

The Vidyapeetha is running since 1.4.1971 in 8 rented buildings. The State Government of J&K has allotted land at Bhilwal for the building of the Vidyapeetha.
