I N T R O D U C T I O NROLE AND FUNCTIONS

The Sansthan was established in 1970 on the recommendations of the Kendriya Sanskrit Parishad as an autonomous Organisation and was registered under the Societies Act XXI of 1860 for the development and promotion of Sanskrit in the country. It functions as an apex body for the propagation and development of Sanskrit and assists the Ministry of Human Resource Development in the formation of various plans and schemes for the development of Sanskrit studies. It has assumed the role for effective implementation of various recommendations made by the Sanskrit Commission set up by the Government of India, Ministry of Education, in 1956 for propagation and development of Sanskrit language and education in all its aspects.

The major objectives of the Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan as indicated in the Memorandum of Association are to propagate, develop and encourage Sanskrit learning and research and to serve as a Central administrative and coordinating machinery for the management of all the Kendriya Sanskrit Vidyapeethas established or taken over.

PROGRAMMES AND ACTIVITIES

For the realisation of the objectives, the Sansthan undertakes the following programmes and activities:-

Conducts, teaching of Sanskrit on traditional lines at Secondary Under-graduate, Graduate, Post-graduate and Doctorate levels.

Conducts, teachers training at graduate and post graduate levels.

Conducts and coordinates research work in various disciplines of Sanskrit learnings.

Cooperates with other organisations in sponsoring joint projects of common interest.

Builds up Sanskrit Libraries and manuscripts collections, edits and publishes rare manuscripts and books of importance.

TEACHING

Teaching is conducted at Shastri and Acharya levels on the basis of syllabus drawn up by the Sansthan in seven of the eight Vidyapeethas, which are constituents of the Sansthan. Sanskrit Institutions, managed by voluntary organisations and affiliated to the Sansthan also impart teaching with the same syllabus. In all the Vidyapeethas there is a two year- buffer course of plus two level called Prak Shastri to facilitate, students who come from non-traditional system of Sanskrit education adopted by the Sansthan.

In Puri and Jammu Vidyapeethas there is also school level teaching, beginning from Prathama (=Classes VI, VII, VIII), upto Purva and Uttara Madhyama.

TEACHERS' TRAINING

In seven Vidyapeethas teachers training of one years' duration with emphasis on practical training, is conducted leading to the award of Shiksha Shastri Degree, which is equivalent to B.Ed. In two Vidyapeethas, at Delhi and Tirupati, teachers' training at Post-graduate level, leading to the award of Shiksha Acharya degree equivalent to M.Ed. is also conducted. Teaching and teaching training are not conducted at Allahabad Vidyapeetha.

RESEARCH

One of the eight Vidyapeethas namely Ganga Nath Jha Kendriya Sanskrit Vidyapeetha, Allahabad is exclusively meant for carrying out research in selected branches. But facilities exist in all the Vidyapeethas for students to enrol themselves for research on successful completion of which the degree of Vidyavaridhi, which is equivalent to Ph.D. is awarded to them.

PUBLICATIONS

The Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan brings out three research journals, namely 'Sanskrit Vimarsha' 'Shodha Prabha and Ganga Nath Jha Research Journal'. While the first journal is brought out by the Sansthan headquarters office, the other two are published by the Lal Bahadur Shastri Kendriya Sanskrit Vidyapeetha, Allahabad respectively.

CULTURAL EXCHANGE AND COLLABORATION

In accordance with the provisions of the cultural exchange agreements entered into by the Government of India with foreign countries, the Sansthan sends Sanskrit scholars to various centres of Sanskrit studies abroad and receives scholars from these places. In addition, the Sansthan also takes active part in the international conferences and seminars. The Sansthan also collaborates with international organisations whose objectives are similar to those of the Sansthan.

STRUCTURE AND ADMINISTRATION

The General Body is the policy making body of the Sansthan. The addition to Adhyaksha and Upadhyaksha there are five other members including the Financial Adviser of the Ministry of H.R.D. (Department of Education) and the Deputy Educational Adviser (Skt) as Ex-Officio Members. The Composition of the Shasi Parishad for the year is given in Annexure 'B'.

The Shasi Parishad is assisted by the following committees.

- i) Artha Samiti
- ii) Vidya Parishad
- iii) Prakshan Samiti
- iv) Pariksha Mandal
- v) Shodha Samiti

The Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan functions through four sections: Academic, Examination, Administration and Finance. The Academic Section consists of three branches, viz. Academic Branch, Research and Publication Branch and Correspondance Course Branch. Each of these branches is headed by Deputy Director. The Examination Section is headed by Deputy Controller (Examination). This branch has in addition an intermediary officer of the rank of Assistant Director. All these officers assist the Director of the Sansthan, who is the Principal Executive Officer responsible for the execution of policies and programmes approved by the General Body.

The Director of the Sansthan is appointed by the Government of India. During April, 1990 Shri D.K. Panwar, I.A.S., Director (L) looked after the work of Director. From May, 1990 till the end of the year Dr. Madhusudan Mishra, D.D. (Acad.) held the charge of Director. From January 4, 1991 Shri P. Thakur, JS(L) has been having the charge of Director.

ACADEMIC SECTION

The Unit headed by Dr. Madhusudan Mishra is mainly responsible for having standards for academic performance, preparation of calendar of the academic programme and for designing the syllabi for various courses. In addition, it also concerns itself with work of affiliation of institutions and award of scholarships.

RESEARCH & PUBLICATION UNIT

The Unit is concerned with implementation and coordination of Research and Publication activities of the constituent Vidyapeethas and of the Research and publication programmes and projects of the Sansthan. From April 1989 Shri A. Sampathnarayanan joined another organisation on deputation and from January, 1990 till the end Shri S.C. Pant was made incharge of the Section as Dy. Director (Res. & Pub.).

CORRESPONDANCE COURSE UNIT

The Unit headed by Dr. K.N. Tiwari is responsible for the organisation of correspondance course. These courses are offered at two levels, viz.

- i) Introductory Course in Sanskrit
1st year (Hindi & English Medium)
- ii) Introductory Course in Sanskrit
2nd year (Hindi & English Medium)

EXAMINATION SECTION

The Examination Section was headed by Shri M.L. Sharma till July, 1990. Thereafter Dr. K.P. Painuly, Asstt. Director (Exam.) was made the full in-charge of the section. The Section organised Annual and supplementary examinations for the following courses.

- Prathama
- Purvamadhyama
- Uttarmadhyama
- Prak Shastri
- Shastri
- Acharya
- Shiksha Shastri

From the year 1989-90, a test for admission to Shiksha-Shastri is being held by the Sansthan. In short, it is called PSST.

It also arranges evaluation of thesis and viva-voce examination for awarding research degrees to the students of Kendriya Sanskrit Vidyapeethas and affiliated institutions. From January, 1990 Shri S.C. Pant, Assistant Director(Examination) was promoted as Deputy Director(Res.& Pub.) and made Incharge of the Section.

ADMINISTRATION SECTION

The Administration Section headed by Shri K.B. Chaube deals with general administration of the Sansthan and its constituent Vidyapeethas. The staffing, appointments and other establishment matters and control over Vidyapeethas are the main responsibilities of this section. Shri Chaube expired in Nov. 1990. Then for some time Shri Dev Dutt, Section Officer, Deptt. of Education, looked after the work of D.D.(A).

FINANCE AND ACCOUNTS SECTION

This section is concerned with the preparation of budget, receipt and distribution of grants, financial management and preparation of annual accounts etc. It also manages provident funds and arranges for disbursement of scholarships awarded under the scheme of the Deptt. of Education. Shri Dhar retired on 31.3.1990. Thereafter Shri S.N. Sahi was appointed as D.D.(F) on deputation from the Ministry, Deptt. of Education.

VIDYAPEETHAS

The Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan has so far established eight Kendriya Sanskrit Vidyapeethas. Their location are indicated below

The school section, from Prathama to Uttarmadyama, runs in only Puri and Jammu Vidyapeethas, while Prak-Shastri, though a part of the school section itself, being a buffer course, is attached to all Vidyapeethas.

Separate subject committees in respect of Sanskrit are constituted on ad-hoc basis to frame the syllabus of Sanskrit subjects from Prathama to Acharya. This is given to Board of Studies constituted as and when required on ad-hoc basis for scrutiny. However, as regards English, Hindi and Modern subjects like History etc., the syllabus of the C.P.S.E. for Central Schools are adopted. As regards the syllabus for modern subjects Hindi & English at Shastri level Delhi University is followed.

During the year under report the syllabus printed during 1988-89 and slightly modified for 1987 and 1988 Annual Examinations was followed.

(d) SCHOLARSHIPS
The scholarship unit has two main branches. One is concerned with the award of scholarship to the Vidyapeethas students. This is done within the budget provision of each Vidyapeetha. The following is the break-down of the award during 1989-90.

ACADEMIC SECTION

As already remarked in the Introductory Chapter this section is headed by a Deputy Director. During the year under report it is running with the following staff:-

The Section Officer has joined other organisation on leave from the Sansthan.

This Section is concerned with the following activities:

- (a) This Section is the Chief Organiser of the Academic activities of the Sansthan, and the framing of syllabus for various courses is the main activity from which all activities start an on which everything hinges.

Separate subjects committees in respect of Sanskrit are constituted on ad-hoc basis to frame the syllabus of Sanskrit subjects from Prathama to Acharya. This is given to Board of studies constituted as and when required on ad-hoc basis for scrutiny. However, as regards, English, Hindi and Modern subjects like History etc., the syllabus of the C.B.S.E. meant for Central Schools are adopted. As regards the syllabus for modern subjects Hindi & English at Shastri level Delhi University is followed.

During the year under report the syllabus printed during 1985-86 and slightly modified for 1987 and 1988 Annual Examinations was followed.

(b) SCHOLARSHIPS

The Scholarship unit has two main branches. One is internal connected with the award of scholarship to the Vidyapeetha students. This is done within the budget provision of each Vidyapeetha. The following is the break-down of the award during 1990-91.

d) AFFILIATION OF INSTITUTION

The Sansthan had started with a few Kendriya Sanskrit Vidyapeethas but later a few private institutions were affiliated. These private institutions have been increasing in number. The Institutions affiliated to the Sansthan are Annexure 'C'. These private institutions are affiliated only for the general course from Prathama to Acharya and Vidyavaridhi.

e) SHASTRA CHUDAMANI

Experienced and retired teachers in traditional learning were appointed in the Kendriya Sanskrit Vidyapeetha to give independent training to the teachers of the Vidyapeethas and to the Research scholars working there. But under this scheme, a scholar is appointed for the second time. Therefore, the number of such scholars has been gradually dwindling. During the year under report no fresh appointment was made.

By the end 1990-91 the whole scheme of Shashtra Chudamani, even that operated by the Ministry, has been transferred to Sansthan. Therefore, from the coming year this scheme may receive and fresh appointments may be done in the Vidyapeethas.

RESEARCH AND PUBLICATION UNIT

The Research and Publication Unit is headed by Deputy Director. During the year under report it is running with the following staff:-

2. One U.D.C.
3. One L.D.C.
4. One Sales-Assistant in the grade of U.D.C.
5. One Library Assistant.

It is responsible for the coordination of Research and Publication work of the headquarters office and the Kendriya Sanskrit Vidyapeetha.

During the year under report, the Publication Committee did not meet. The 17th volume of Sansthan's half yearly research journal 'Sanskrit Vimarsha' (Part I and II) was brought out during the last year. The material for the 18th Volume has been sent to the press and it may come out during the next year. The Delhi and Allahabad Vidyapeethas also brought out their regular journals 'Shodha Prabha' and G.N. Jha Research journal' respectively. There was a meeting of the Research Committee on 7-8/2/91.

With the financial assistance of the Ford Foundation the Sansthan has taken up two projects. Namely "Preparation of 'Who's Who of living traditional scholars in India" and "Tape recording of Oral Shashtra Traditions".

WHO'S WHO PROJECT

The Sansthan's headquarters office has taken up this project from April, 1986. During the period under report, the press copy is being prepared to be handed over to the Sahitya Academy for printing and publication.

TAPE RECORDING OF ORAL SHASTRA TRADITIONS

This project is being operated by the Tirupati Vidyapeetha. The progress with held for some reasons.

SHAIVA DARSHAN PROJECT

This project is running at Jammu Vidyapeetha. The press copy has been sent to the press and printing may start very soon.

CORRESPONDENCE COURSE

The Correspondence Course Unit was established as a separate Unit under the Academic Section exclusively for Sansthan teaching correspondence. For more than 10 years this section has been organising Sanskrit Language teaching at preliminary stage through correspondence in both English & Hindi medium. This course is divided into two levels of 21 lessons each and is covered through correspondence in a maximum period of two years. Two lessons are despatched to the registered students every month and students, after every grasping the lessons, are expected to answer the questions given in the response sheet at the end of each lesson. The response sheets are returned to answer the questions given in the response sheets are returned by students to the headquarters office of the Sansthan where they are evaluated by the evaluators and the corrected response sheets are returned to the students for their guidance.

During the year 1990 i.e. from January to December, 1990 students were registered for these two courses as per details given below:-

The course is being organised free of cost but in order to ensure that only genuine students are enrolled a token annual fee of Rs.15/- per student in India and US 10 per student abroad is charged for the aspirants.

In order to make these courses more popular and its enable a large number of aspirants to avail of this facility, a number of steps were taken by the Sansthan a wide publicity was made in English and vernacular press through the Directorate of vdiio Vishal Public, letters were addressed to foreign embassies and consulates in Delhi to Vice-Chancellors of the Universities in India and so on. As a result of those efforts of the addition of young students, a number of high ranking officers and people in various vacations have registered their names with the Sansthan and are learning Sanskrit through the correspondence course.

Those who complete these course successfully got a certificate entitled 'Sanskrit Pravasha'.

EXAMINATION SECTION

The Examination Section is headed by Deputy Controller (Examination) with a three tier staffing pattern. It is mainly responsible for the evaluation examinations of the Sansthan. Various examinations such as Prathama to Acharya including Shiksha-Shastri, Shiksha Acharya and Vidyavaridhi are conducted by the Sansthan. In these examinations students both from the constituent Vidyapeethas as well as the affiliated institutions are admitted. These examinations are conducted in accordance with the guidelines provided by the Academic Council and the syllabus laid down for the purpose. Several Sub-Committee work under the direct supervision of the Examination Board to look into the individual items of Examinations.

This Section is headed by a Deputy Director. During the year under report. It was running with following staff.

The Administration Section in the headquarter office of the Rashtriya Sanskrit Parforms its functions if house keeping in accordance with rules regulations and procedure. It provided the necessary support to the various constituent Vidyapeethas of the Sansthan for their effective and efficient functioning. This main deals with general administration, establishment matters, services & supplies and acquisition of land & building, establishment of new Kendriya Sanskrit Vidyapeethas and conducting meetings of Sha Parishad and General Body of the Sansthan.

Efferts have been made to acquire land and for the construct of building for these Vidyapeethas, which are not having their own building. In this connection, apiece of land has been acquired at Ehalwal with the assistance of State Government of J&K for construction of building of Shri Ranbir Kendriya Sanskrit Vidyapeetha, Jammu. Action for construction of boundary wall on this land is under process. The State Government of Orissa has been allotted a piece of land at Bhuvaneshwar for construction of building of our Puri Vidyapeetha. Action for registration of the land is under process. Action for construction of building will be taken immediately after the registration of the land. Similar action is also being taken in respect of Jaipur and Lucknow Vidyapeethas. Where as the respective State Government have already allotted land for construction of building.

At present there are eight constituent Vidyapeethas under the Sansthan. But Delhi and Puri Vidyapeethas are in the process of being turned into Deemed universities. They will start working with their own staff and equipment from the next year. Apiece of Land measuring 1.70 across has already been acquired with the assistance of the Statement for construction of building of the Vidyapeetha Calcutta.

FINANCE & ACCOUNTS SECTION

This Section is headed by the Deputy Director(Finance) and comprises one Section Officer, One Assistant, One UDC and four IDC's. The following are the main activities of the Section during the period under report.

- (a) Obtaining Budget estimates from the constituent Vidyapeetha and preparation of consolidated budget estimates for the Sansthan as a whole and getting it approved by the Ministry of Human Resource Development.
- (b) Preparation of annual accounts for the Headquarters office and consolidated annual accounts for the Sansthan its constituent Vidyapeethas. After getting these accounts audited and certified by the Director of Audit Central Revenue submission of the accounts to the Ministry for being laid on the table of the Parliament.
- (c) Control of expenditure: for this purpose periodical expenditure statements are obtained from the Vidyapeethas.
- (d) Preparation of pay bills, medical bills and bills relating to various advances like Festival Advance, House Building Advance and Conveyance advance etc.
- (e) Issue of sanctions relating to advances for purchase of conveyance, advances from provident fund accounts, final withdrawal etc.
- (f) Maintenance of cash book, ledger accounts, Registers of various advances, PBR, Fund Broad Sheets and personal accounts files relating to the staff in the headquarters office.
- (g) Calculation of Income Tax, Interest on fund accounts interest bearing advances and leave Salary and Pension Contribution.
- (h) Scrutiny of purchases and other bills received from Administration Section, Purchase of books and printing bills received from Academic Section, remuneration bills received from Examination Section & C.C. Section.
- (i) Control,of interest granted for purchase of stamps to Administration, Examination, Academic, and C.C. Section.
- (j) Receipt of Audit Report from various Accounts General and Directors of Audit, their pursuit and settlement of and objection in consultation with the Principals of the Vidyapeethas.

BUDGET

An unspent balance of Rs.13.00 Lakhs was carried over from the year 1989-90 to the financial year 1990-91. A total budget of Rs.308 Lakhs (including the previous unspent balance) was sanctioned by the Ministry. The amount was further allocated among the constituent units in the following manner:-

These funds were utilised during the year on pay and allowance scholarships and other maintenance items of expenditure. An unspent balance of Rs.77.17 Lakhs was left over in order to meet the expenditure during the first few months of the following financial year till the fresh grant-in-aid was received.

ACCOUNTS

While the accounts of the constituent Vidyapeetha were audited and certified by the respective Accounts General during the year itself, there was some delay in the submission of the consolidated accounts as the meeting of Arth Samiti of Shasi Parishad could not be held during the year under report. The audited accounts for 1990-91 are however being placed before the both houses of Parliament. Audited Receipt and Payment Accounts are placed at Annexure 'D'.

MAINTENANCE OF PROVIDENT FUND ACCOUNTS

The section has maintained pay and provident fund accounts for officers and members of the staff of the headquarters office. Every member was supplied with the annual provident fund account seen after the close of the financial year.

PURSUIT OF AUDIT OBJECTIONS

Concurred efforts were made during the year to get the audit objections settled. For this purpose, the individual Vidyapeetha were directed to take necessary corrective measures and replies to compliance were sent to the audit authorities with the result that a number of audit objections were got settled during the year.

INTERNAL AUDIT

The staff meant for internal audit is yet to be sanctioned. However, the Sansthan has managed to conduct internal of its constituent units by making internal arrangements during the year under report, and by deploying Section Officers of the Vidyapeetha and headquarters for this assignment.

SHRI SADASHIV KENDRIYA SANSKRIT VIDYAPEETHA: PURI

On 15th August, 1971 the former Sadashiva Sanskrit College, Puri functioning under the State Government with its long association with the study of Sanskrit in traditional form, was taken over by the Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan, New Delhi. The old Sadashiva Sanskrit College, Puri was renamed as Shri Sadashiva Kendriya Sanskrit Vidyapeetha, Puri. The newly born institution is trying persistently and baselessly to achieve the ultimate goal from which it has been established.

GANGA NATH JHA KENDRIYA SANSKRIT VIDYAPEETHA: ALLAHABAD

The Ganganath Jha Kendriya Sanskrit Vidyapeetha, Allahabad is a Research Institute which is a part of the Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan, an autonomous body under the Ministry of Education and Culture, New Delhi. The Vidyapeetha admits every year a certain number of Research Scholars to carry out Research work for the Ph. D. (Vidyavaridhi) Degree of the Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan. The scholars thus enrolled work under the guidance of one of the members of the academic staff of the Vidyapeetha utilising the facilities available in the Library of the Vidyapeetha as well as in its Manuscripts Wing. The use of the Library and the Manuscripts is limited to the staff and the scholars of the Vidyapeetha. The Vidyapeetha open-hearted welcome people from all walks of life interested in Sanskrit and ancient Indian Culture to make from use of its Library subject to its capacity.

The Vidyapeetha at present has an academic staff of five Readers, four Lecturers and five Research Assistants, all of whom besides guiding the research work of the student pursue their own research work assigned to them by the Sansthan. The Research Project of the Vidyapeetha are carried out not only individually but also as a team work. The control research activity of the Vidyapeetha consists of the preparation of critical editions of higher to unknown and unpublished Sanskrit texts. For this purpose mainly the manuscripts preserved in our Library are used and their text is compared and collated with the manuscripts or copies thereof procured from all over the world. To a limited extent, studies, in problems of Sanskrit language and literature and literature religion and Philosophy are also conducted. An important feature of this Institute since 1979 is the functioning of for the simplification of Sanskrit Teaching.

MANUSCRIPT LIBRARY

The Manuscript Library of this Vidyapeetha contains 44,200 volumes of these 1218 manuscripts have been procured in the year 1987-88. Those volumes cover almost all fields and Shastras in which Sanskrit books have been written in the past. The nucleus of this Library was formed by the Miss. Collection of Ganganath Jha which was donated this Institute when it was founded. There were about this about 13,000 accessioned manuscript at the time of takeover in 1971. This number has now swollen to 44,200 and most of these 30,000 manuscripts have been purchased in the last few years.

Though these manuscripts belong to all branches of Sanskrit learning as already said, the Library is especially rich in the manuscript pertaining to Tantra, Nyaya, Dharam-Shastra and Sahitya. Many of these manuscripts have been or being edited by the Research Officer and students of this Vidyapeetha and some of them have already been published.

RESEARCH PROJECTS COMPLETED/PUBLICATIONS

The main activity of the Vidyapeetha is to prepare critical editions of unpublished Sanskrit texts on the basis of manuscripts. However, it also undertakes and carries out other bigger projects. The most stupendous Research Project completed this year after a constant labour of eight years of the PUNJABI SANSKRIT GLOSSERY of a dictionary of the words of Sanskrit origin which are in use in Punjabi language. This Dictionary shall be of great help in preparing Sanskrit courses for Punjabi speaking people. The Dictionary was formally released by Hon'ble Dr. Shankar Dayal Sharma, the Vice-President of India on the 2nd February, 1988. Praising the Dictionary, he described it as a great academic achievement and hoped that similar Dictionaries in other languages would also be prepared.

The Vidyapeetha has its own publication and sales Unit. The Research Programme of the Vidyapeetha, when completed, are published by the Institute itself and are available for sale. The Vidyapeetha has also been regularly publishing a quarterly Research Journal of Indology since its beginning (1943). This Journal which is running into 44 year of its publication has long since attained an international status and reputed scholars from all over the world regularly contribute to it. No teacher is imparted in this Vidyapeetha. However, since a few years unique scheme for the preservation of ancient Shastras has been launched by the Ministry of Education Government of India, under which talented students after completion of their studies as well as teachers are selected for a deeper, intensive and profound study of the most important texts irrespective of any restriction of study-period or load of examination. Under this "Shashtra Chudamani" scheme one veteran scholar, namely Dr. C.B. Tripathi, is attached to this Vidyapeetha.

LIBRARY

The Vidyapeetha is proud of its rich Library of Indological books and Journals. It contains approximately 54,000 volumes including 6000 Volumes of various journals in the year 1987-88. 708 new books and 127 volumes of journals were added to our stock. It contains not only ancient and rare text of Sanskrit but also secondary literature and studies on various topics pertaining to Indological subjects such as Indian Religion, Philosophy, History, Art and Architecture, National Sciences, Literature and Languages. We try to procure all important publications not only in Hindi and English but also written in other European and Indian Language such as German, French, Russian, Italian, Japanese, Bangali, Gujarati, Marathi and Tamil. The procurement system of the Library is so perfect that there is hardly any important publication in the field of Indology published in the past few years which may not be available in our Library.
