I N T R O D U C T I O NRole and functions

The Sansthan was established in 1970 on the recommendations of the Kendriya Sanskrit Parishad as an autonomous Organisation and was registered under the Societies Act XXI of 1960 for the development and promotion of Sanskrit in the country. It functions as an apex body for the propagation and development of Sanskrit and assists the Ministry of Human Resource Development in the formation of various plans and schemes for the development of Sanskrit studies. It has also assumed the role for effective implementation of various recommendations made by the Sanskrit Commission set up by the Govt. of India, Ministry of Education, in 1956 for propagation and development of Sanskrit language and education in all its aspects.

The major objectives of the Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan as indicated in the Memorandum of Association are to propagate, develop and encourage Sanskrit learning and research and to serve as a central administrative and coordinating machinery for the management of all the Kendriya Sanskrit Vidyapeethas established or taken over.

PROGRAMMES AND ACTIVITIES

For the realisation of the objectives, the Sansthan undertakes the following programmes and activities:

Conducts teaching of Sanskrit on traditional lines at Secondary, Under-graduate, Graduate, Post-graduate and Doctorate levels.

Conducts, teachers' training at graduate and post-graduate levels.

Conducts examinations at Secondary, Graduation and post-graduation levels.

Conducts and coordinates research work in various disciplines of Sanskrit learnings.

Cooperates with other organisations in sponsoring joint projects of common interest.

Builds up Sanskrit libraries and manuscripts collections: edits and publishes rare manuscripts and books of importance.

Functions as the national association of the International Association of Sanskrit studies and implements cultural exchange programme with Centres of Indology and Sanskrit studies abroad.

### TEACHING:

Teaching is conducted at Shastri and Acharya levels on the basis of syllabus drawn up by the Sansthan in seven of the eight Vidyapeethas, which are constituents of the Sansthan. Sanskrit Institutions, managed by voluntary organisations and affiliated to the Sansthan, also impart teaching with the same syllabus. In all the Vidyapeethas there is a two-year buffer course of plus two level called Prak-Shastri to facilitate students who come from non-traditional streams to fit in the traditional system of Sanskrit education adopted by the Sansthan.

In addition, in two of the Vidyapeethas, secondary level teaching on the 10+2 pattern is also undertaken. These classes act as feeder for our degree classes.

### Teachers' training:

In seven of the eight Vidyapeethas, teachers training of one Year's duration with emphasis on practical training, is conducted leading to the award of Shiksha-Shastri Degree, which is equivalent to B.Ed. In two Vidyapeethas, at Delhi & Tirupati, teacher's training at Post-graduate level, leading to the award of Shiksha-Acharya degree, equivalent to M.Ed. is also conducted.

### Research:

One of the eight Vidyapeethas is exclusively meant for carrying out research in selected branches. Facilities exist in all the Vidyapeethas for students to enrol themselves for research on successful completion of which the degree of Vidyavaridhi, which is equivalent to Ph.D. is awarded to them.

### Publications

The Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan brings out three prestigious journals, namely 'Sanskrit Vimarsha', 'Shodha Prabha' and 'Ganga Nath Jha Research Journal'. While the first journal is brought out by the Sansthan Headquarter office, the other two are published by the Lal Bhadur Shastri Kendriya Sanskrit Vidya-peetha, New Delhi and Ganga Nath Jha Kendriya Sanskrit Vidyapeetha, Allahabad, respectively. In addition, publication of rare manuscripts with commentaries is also under-taken in a phased programme.

### Cultural Exchange and Collaboration:

In accordance with the provisions of the cultural exchange agreements entered into by the Govt. of India with foreign countries, the Sansthan sends Sanskrit Scholars to various centres of Sanskrit studies abroad and receives scholars from these places. In addition, the Sansthan also takes active part in the international conferences and seminars. The Sansthan also collaborates with such international organisations whose objectives are similar to those of the Sansthan.

### Structure and Administration:

The General Body is the policy making body of the Sansthan. The members of the General Body of the Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan are indicated at Annexure-A.

The Shasi Parishad is the Executive Body of the Sansthan. In addition to Adhyaksha and Upadhyaksha there are five other members including the Financial Adviser of the Ministry of H.R.D. (Dept of Edu.) and the Deputy Educational Adviser (Skt.) as Ex-Officio Members. The Composition of the Shasi Parishad for the year is given in Annexure-B.

The Shasi Parishad is assisted by the following committees.

The Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan functions through four sections: Academic, Examination, Administration, and Finance. The Academic Section consists of three branches, viz. Academic Branch, Research and Publication Branch and Correspondance Course Branch. Each of these branches is headed by a Dy. Director. The Examination Section is headed by Dy. Controller of Examination. This branch has in addition an intermediary officer of the rank of Assistant Director. All these officers assist the Director of the Sansthan, who is the Principal Executive Officer responsible for the execution of policies and programmes approved by the General Body.

The Director of the Sansthan is appointed by the Govt. of India. During this year, Dr. Mandan Mishra, worked as Director.

Academic Section:

The Unit headed by Dr. Madhusudan Mishra is mainly responsible for having standards for academic performance, preparation of calender of the academic programme and for designing the syllabi for various courses. In addition, it also concerns itself with the work of affiliation of institutions and award of scholarships.

Research & Publication Unit:

The Unit headed by Sh. A. Sampathnarayanan is concerned with implementation and coordination of Research and Publication activities of the constituent Vidyapeethas and of the Research and Publication programmes and projects of the Sansthan.

Correspondence Course Unit:

The Unit headed by Dr. K. N. Tiwari is responsible for the organisation of correspondence course. These courses are offered at two levels, viz.

- i) Introductory Course in Sanskrit  
1st year (Hindi & English medium)
- ii) Introductory Course in Sanskrit  
2nd year (Hindi and English Medium)

Examination Section:

The Examination Section is headed by Sh.M.L.Sharma, and Assisted by Sh.S.C.Pant. The Section organised Annual and supplementary examinations for the following courses.

It also arranges evaluation of thesis and Viva-voce examination for awarding research degrees to the students of Kendriya Sanskrit Vidyapeethas and affiliated research institutions.

Administration Section

The Administration Section headed by Sh.K.B.Chaube, deals with general administration of the Sansthan and its constituent Vidya-peethas. The staffing, appointments and other establishment matters and controls over Vidyapeethas are the main responsibilities of this section.

Finance and Accounts Section:

This section headed by Sh.T.N.Dhar, is concerned with the preparation of budget, receipt and distribution of grants, Financial management and preparation of annual accounts, etc. It also manages provident funds and arranges for disbursement of scholarships awarded under the scheme of the Ministry of Education.

Academic Section

As already remarked in the Introductory Chapter, this section is headed by a Dy. Director. During the year under report it is running with the following staff:

1. One Section Officer
2. One Assistant
3. One U.D.C.

This section is concerned with the following activities.

a) This section is the Chief organiser of the academic activities of the Sansthan, and the framing of syllabus for various courses is the main activity from which all activities start and on which everything hinges.

Separate subjects committees in respect of Sanskrit are constituted on ad-hoc basis to frame the syllabus of Sanskrit subject from Prathama to Acharya. This is given to Board of studies constituted as and when required on ad-hoc basis for scrutiny. However, as regards, English, Hindi and Modern subjects like History, etc., the syllabus of the C.B.S.E. meant for Central Schools are adopted. As regards the syllabus for the regional languages, the syllabus of the State Board are followed. As regards the syllabus for modern subjects, Hindi & English at Shastri Level Delhi University is followed.

During the year under report the syllabus printed during 1985-86 and slightly modified for 1987 Annual Examination was followed.

b) Scholarship

The scholarship unit has two main branches. One is internal connected with the award of scholarships to the Vidyapeetha students. This is done within the budget provision of each Vidyapeetha. The following is the break-down of the award during 1987-88.

RESEARCH AND PUBLICATION UNIT

The Research and Publication Unit is headed by a Dy. Director. During the year under report it is running with the following staff:

1. One Research Assistant
2. One U.D.C.
3. One L.D.C.
4. One Sales-Assistant in the grade of U.D.C.
5. One Library Assistant

It is responsible for the coordination of Research and Publication work of the Headquarters office and the Kendriya Sanskrit Vidyapeetha.

During the year under report, the Publication Committee met once. The Committee approved ten titles for Publication by the Headquarter office and the Vidyapeethas. The fifteenth volume of Sansthan's half yearly research journal 'Sanskrit Vimarsha' was brought out during the year. The Delhi and Allahabad Vidyapeethas also brought out their regular journals 'Shodha Prabha' and 'G.N.Jha Research Journal' respectively. With the financial assistance of the Ford Foundation the Sansthan has taken up two projects namely 'Preparation of Who's Who of living traditional scholars in India' and 'Tape recording of Oral Shastra Traditions'.

#### WHO'S WHO PROJECT

The Sansthan's Hq. Office has taken up this project from April, 86. During the period under report, seventy information collectors in different parts of the country were on the job of collecting information about the scholars. Printed detailed letters, guidelines and questionnaires were sent to all the Universities, eminent personalities in the field, other organisations and institutions of the country. Different medias of publicity were contacted and announcements have already appeared. So far, we have received about 1000 questionnaires duly filled up. Press copy is being prepared of the collected material.

#### TAPE RECORDING OF ORAL SHASTRA TRADITIONS

This project is being operated by the Timupati Vidyapeetha. During the year, 19 eminent scholars delivered discourses on the topics of Mimamsa and Nyaya Shastras. 53 topics were recorded in about 145 hours by scholars.

Nyaya recording continued. Press copy of recorded speech is prepared.

#### KASHMIR SHAIVA DARSHAN KOSHA PROJECT

This project is in progress in the Jammu Vidyapeetha. Fair copies of the cards are being prepared caligraphically for the press.

During the year 1987-88, one meeting of the Research Committee was held. In this meeting 85 research scholars were registered for Vidyavaridhi. Vidyavaridhi degree were awarded to 27 scholars during the year.

A pre-research course of 6 weeks duration was conducted at Delhi Vidyapeetha. About 100 research scholars of different Vidyapeethas attended this course. Many prominent scholars delivered lectures on various topics of research.

CORRESPONDENCE COURSE

The Correspondence Course Unit was established as a separate Unit under the Academic Section exclusively for Sanskrit teaching through correspondence. For more than 10 years this section has been organising Sanskrit language teaching at preliminary stage through correspondence in both English & Hindi medium. This course is divided into two levels of 21 lessons each and is covered through correspondence in a maximum period of two years. Two lessons are despatched to the registered students every month and students, after grasping the lesson, are expected to answer the questions given in the response sheet at the end of each lesson. The response sheet are returned by students to the Headquarter Office of the Sansthan where they are evaluated by the evaluators, and corrected response sheets are returned to the students for their guidance.

During the year 1987 i.e. from January to December, 1987 students were registered for these two courses as per details given below:-

This course is being organised free of cost but, in order to ensure that only genuine students are enrolled a token annual fee of Rs.15/- per student in India and US \$ 10 per student abroad is charged from the aspirants.

In order to make these courses more popular and to enable a large number of aspirants to avail of this facility, a number of steps were taken by the Sansthan; a wide publicity was made

English and vernacular press through the Directorate of Audio-visual Publicity, letters were addressed to foreign Embassies and Consulates in Delhi and to Vice-Chancellors of the Universities in India, and so on. As a result of these efforts, in addition to young students, a number of high ranking officers and people in various vocations have registered their names with the Sanshan and are learning Sanskrit through the correspondence course.

Those who complete these courses successfully get a certificate entitled 'Sanskrit Pravesha'.

EXAMINATION SECTION

The Examination Section is headed by a Deputy Controller (Examination) with a three tier staffing pattern. It is mainly responsible for the evaluation of performance of students who take various examinations of the Sansthan. Various examinations such as Prathama to Acharya including Shiksha-Shastri, Shiksha Acharya and Vidyavaridhi are conducted by the Sansthan. In these examinations students both from the constituent Vidyapeethas as well as the affiliated institutions are admitted. These examinations are conducted in accordance with the guidelines provided by the Academic Council and the syllabus laid down for the purpose. Several Sub-Committees work under the direct supervision of the Examination Board to look into the individual items of Examination.

ADMINISTRATION SECTION

This section is headed by a Deputy Director. During the year under report, it was running with following staff:

The Administration Section in the Headquarter office of the Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan performs its functions of house keeping in accordance with rules, regulations and procedure. It provided the necessary support to the various constituent Vidyapeethas of the Sansthan for their effective and efficient functioning. This mainly deals with general administration, establishment matters, services & supplies and acquisition of land & building, establishment of new Kendriya Sanskrit Vidyapeethas and conducting meetings of Shasi Parishad and General Body of the Sansthan.

Efforts have been made to acquire land and for the construction of building for those Vidyapeethas, which are not having their own building. In this connection, a piece of land has been acquired at Bhalwal with the assistance of state Govt. of J & K for construction of building of Sh. Ranbir Kendriya Sanskrit Vidyapeetha, Jammu. Action for construction of boundary wall on this land is under process. The State Govt. of Orissa has also allotted a piece of land at Bhuvaneshwar for construction of building of our Puri Vidyapeetha. Action for registration of the land in the name of the Vidyapeetha is under process. Action for construction of building will be taken immediately after the registration of the land. Similar action is also being taken in respect of Jaipur and Lucknow Vidyapeetha, where the respective State Govt. have already allotted land for construction of building.

At present there are 8 Constituent Vidyapeethas under the Sansthan. A piece of land measuring 1.79 acre has already been acquired with the assistance of the State Government for construction of building of the Vidyapeetha at Calcutta.

FINANCE & ACCOUNTS SECTION

This section is headed by the Deputy Director (Finance) and comprises one Section Officer, One Assistant, One UDC and four LDCs. The following are the main activities of the Section during the period under report.

- a) Obtaining Budget Estimates from the constituent Vidyapeethas and preparation of consolidated budget estimates for the Sansthan as a whole and getting it approved by the Ministry of Human Resource Development.
- b) Preparation of annual accounts for the Headquarters office and consolidated annual accounts for the Sansthan and its constituent Vidyapeethas. After getting these accounts audited and certified by the Director of Audit Central Revenues submission of the accounts to the Ministry for being laid on the table of the Parliament.
- c) Control of expenditure: For this purpose periodical expenditure statements are obtained from the Vidyapeethas.
- d) Preparation of pay bills, medical bills and bills relating to various advances like Festival Advance, House Building Advance and Conveyance Advance etc.
- e) Issue of sanctions relating to advances for purchase of conveyance, advances from provident fund accounts, final withdrawals etc.
- f) Maintenance of cash book, ledger accounts, Registers of various advances, PBR, Fund broad sheets and personal accounts files relating to the staff in the Headquarter office.
- g) Calculation of Income Tax, interest on fund accounts, interest bearing advances and Leave Salary & Pension Contribution.
- h) Scrutiny of purchases and other bills received from Admn. Section, Purchase of books and printing bills received from Academic Section, remuneration bills received from Examination Section & C.C. Section.
- i) Control of imprest granted for purchase of stamps to Admn., Examination, Academic and C.C. Section.

j) Receipt of Audit Report from various Accountants General and Directors of Audit, their pursuit and settlement of audit objection in consultation with the Principals of the Vidyapeethas.

BUDGET

An unspent balance of Rs.42.06 lakhs was carried over from the year 1986-87 to the financial year 1987-88. A total budget of Rs.304.74 lakhs (including the previous unspent balance) was sanctioned by the Ministry. This was almost five-times the amount sanctioned ten years back in 1976-77 (Rs.67.83) and more than twice the amount sanctioned five years back during 1981-82 (Rs.119.66). The amount was further allocated among the constituent units in the following manner:-

These funds were utilised during the year on pay and allowances, scholarships and other maintenance items of expenditure. The expenditure on Jaipur and Lucknow Vidyapeethas was met from out of funds under Plan and in addition special projects, building activities and purchase of assets were financed from the Plan funds. An unspent balance of Rs.25.18 lakhs was left over in order to meet the expenditure during the first few months of the following financial year till the grant in aid was received.

## Accounts

The Sansthan was in arrears so far as preparation and submission of accounts was concerned. However, with a concerted effort of the section we have been able to clear the back log and the submission of accounts for the year 1986-87 only was in arrears. While the accounts of the constituent Vidyapeethas were audited and certified by the respective Accountants General during the year itself, there was some delay in the submission of the consolidated accounts which have been audited during the subsequent year. The audited accounts for 1986-87 were however placed before the both houses of Parliament during the period under report. Audited Receipt & Payment Accounts are placed at Annexure-D.

## MAINTAINANCE OF ACCOUNTS

The Section has maintained pay and provident fund accounts for officers and members of the staff of the Headquarters office. Every member was supplied with the annual provident fund account soon after the close of the financial year and their pay and allowances as also arrears were drawn in time. The revised pay scale of Teaching staff were adopted in the Sansthan with the approval of the Chairman and arrears accruing as a result thereof were also paid to the staff during the period under report.

## SCRUTINY OF BILLS

During the year a total number of 2965 bills were received from various sections of the Headquarters Office and payment of these bills was made after due scrutiny.

## ISSUE OF SANCTIONS

During the financial year 1987-88 sanctions were issued authorising advances from provident fund, advances for purchases of conveyances, fan and advances on account of various festivals

### PURSUIT OF AUDIT OBJECTIONS

Concerted efforts were made during the year to get the audit objections settled. For this purpose, the individual Vidyapeethas were directed to take necessary corrective measures and replies of compliance were sent to the audit authorities with the result that a number of audit objections were got settled during the year.

### INTERNAL AUDIT

The staff meant for internal audit is yet to be sanctioned. However, the Sansthan has managed to conduct internal audit of its constituent units by making internal arrangements during the period under report, and by deploying Section Officers of the Vidyapeethas and Headquarters for this assignment.

### SCHOLARSHIPS ON BEHALF OF THE MINISTRY

The Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan is operating two schemes of scholarships on behalf of the Ministry of Human Resource Development. The first scheme relates to payment of scholarships to the students prosecuting studies in Sanskrit at Post-Matric level and the second scheme covers the students studying in traditional system leading to the award of Vidyavaridhi degree. Under these schemes, an amount of Rs.9.50 lakhs was provided to the Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan. Scholarships amounting to Rs.10.22 lakhs which includes unspent balance of previous year and refunds from universities were distributed to various Universities leaving a small balance of Rs.4,000/- The rate of scholarships for various classes is given below:-

In 1961 the Kendriya Sanskrit Vidyapeetha Society was registered as an autonomous body under the Ministry of Education, Govt. of India. This Society was dissolved in 1970 when the Vidyapeetha was handed over to the Sansthan. Since then, it is running as a constituent unit of the Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan.

It has at present several departments, namely Padagogy, Research and Publication, Acharya Wing, Library, Manuscripts, Tape Recording and Mimamsa under oral Shastric tradition. It also undertakes other activities like elocution contest, extension lectures scouting, tour and first aid etc.

IV) GANGANATHA JHA KENDRIYA SANSKRIT VIDYAPEETHA  
ALLAHABAD

The Ganganatha Jha Kendriya Sanskrit Vidyapeetha, Allahabad is a Research Institution which is a part of the Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan, an autonomous body under the Ministry of Education and Culture, New Delhi. The Vidyapeetha admits every year a certain number of Research Scholars to carry out Research work for the Ph.D. (Vidyavaridhi) Degree of the Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan. The scholars thus enrolled work under the guidance of one of the members of the academic staff of the Vidyapeetha utilising the facilities available in the Library of the Vidyapeetha as well as its Manuscript-Wing. The use of the Library and the Manuscripts is not limited to the staff and the scholars of the Vidyapeetha. The Vidyapeetha open-heartedly welcome people from all walks of life interested in Sanskrit and ancient Indian Culture to make free use of its Library subject to its capacity.

The Vidyapeetha at present has an academic staff of five Readers, four Lecturers and five Research Assistants, all of whom besides guiding the research work of the students-pursue their own research work assigned to them by the Sansthan. The Research Projects of the Vidyapeetha are carried out not only individually but also as a team work. The central research activity of the Vidyapeetha consists of the preparation of critical editions of hitherto unknown and unpublished Sanskrit texts. For this purpose mainly the manuscripts preserved in our Library are used and their text is compared and collated with the manuscripts or copies thereof procured from all over the world. To a limited extent, studies in problems of Sanskrit language and Literature, Religion and Philosophy are also conducted. An important feature of this Institute since 1979 is the functioning of a Linguistic Unit which is striving to devise means and methods for the simplification of Sanskrit Teaching.

The Vidyapeetha has its own publication and sales unit. The Research Programme of the Vidyapeetha, when completed, are published by the Institute itself and are available for sale. The Vidyapeetha has also been regularly publishing a quarterly Research Journal of Indology since its beginning (1943). This Journal which is running into 44th year of its publication has long since attained an international status and reputed scholars from all over the world regularly contribute to it.

No teaching is imparted in this Vidyapeetha. However, since a few years unique scheme for the preservation of ancient Shastras has been launched by the Ministry of Education, Govt. of India under which talented students after completion of their studies as well as teachers are selected for a deeper, intensive and profound study of the most important Shastric texts irrespective of any restriction of study-period or load of examination. Under this "Shashtra-Cudamani" scheme one veteran scholar, namely Dr. C. B. Tripathi, is attached to this Vidyapeetha.

#### LIBRARY

The Vidyapeetha is proud of its rich Library of Indological books and journals. It contains approximately 54,000 volumes including 6000 volumes of various journals. In the year 1987-88, 708 new books and 127 volumes of journals were added to our stock. It contains not only ancient and rare text of Sanskrit but also secondary literature and studies on various topics pertaining to Indological subjects such as Indian Religion, Philosophy, History, Art and Architecture, Natural Sciences, Literature and Languages. We try to procure all important publications not only in Hindi and English but also written in other European and Indian Languages such as German, French, Russian, Italian, Japanese, Bengali, Gujrati, Marathi and Tamil. The procurement system of the Library is so perfect that there is hardly any important publication in the field of Indology published in the past few years which may not be available in our Library.

The Vidyapeetha also subscribes all Indological Journals of repute published either in India or abroad. A number of Sanskrit Magazines are also received regularly in the Library.

#### MANUSCRIPT LIBRARY

The manuscript library of this Vidyapeetha contains 44,200 volumes. Of these 1218 manuscripts have been procured in the year 1987-88. These volumes cover almost all fields and Shastras in which Sanskrit books have been written in the past. The nucleus of this Library was formed by the Mss. collection of Sir Ganganath Jha which was donated to this Institute when it was founded. There were about 13,000 accessioned manuscripts at the time of take-over in 1971. This number has now swollen to 44,200 and most of these 30,000 manuscripts have been purchased in the last few years. Though these manuscripts belong to all branches of Sanskrit learning as already said, the Library is especially rich in the manuscript pertaining to Tantra, Nyaya, Dharam-Shastra and Sahitya. Many of these manuscripts have been or are being edited by the Research Officer and students of this Vidyapeetha and some of them have already been published.

#### RESEARCH PROJECTS COMPLETED/PUBLICATIONS.

-The main activity of the Vidyapeetha is to prepare critical editions of unpublished Sanskrit texts on the basis of manuscripts. However, it also undertakes and carries out other bigger projects. The most stupendous Research Project completed this year after a constant labour of eight years is of the compilation of the Punjabi Sanskrit Glossary, or a dictionary of the words of Sanskrit origin which are in use in Punjabi languages. This Dictionary shall be of great help in preparing Sanskrit courses for Punjabi speaking people. The Dictionary was formally released by Hon'ble Dr. Shankar Dayal Sharma, the Vice-President of India on the 2nd February, 1988. Praising the Dictionary, he described it as a great academic achievement and hoped that similar Dictionaries in other languages would also be prepared.

Other publications released during this year are:

1. Laohu Varttikam - ascribed to Kumarila Bhatta edited by Dr. Kamal Nayan Sharma and published for the first time.
2. Ajits : Part I - A commentary on the Tantravarttika of Kumarila by Paritosh Mishra, edited by Dr. Kishore Nath Jha and other and published for the first time.

In all, the Vidyapeetha has published 54 (fifty four) works of outstanding merit since its inception till now (March 1988).

The projects in hand are:

1. Preparation of a dictionary of the meanings of Rgvedic words according to Indian Commentators (Veda Bhashya Kosha).
2. Compilation of the sentences of practical conversational use from Sanskrit dramas (Vyavaharik Vakya Kosha).
3. Composition of Sanskrit language courses for Punjabi speaking people.

A Record number of 17 (seventeen) thesis were submitted to the Sansthan during the current year for examination.

The total number of thesis submitted to the Sansthan from 1978 to March 1988 are 68 (sixty eight).

### FUNCTIONS AND EXTRA CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

1. The Vidyapeetha celebrated its Foundation Day on the 19th November, 1987 with great fanfare. A number of Sanskrit items were presented to the public. The main attraction of the function was the Sanskrit drama Urubhangam by Bhasa which was staged with great dexterity by our students.
2. A drama team of the Vidyapeetha was invited in August 1987 to stage a dance-drama called Sangita-Meohadutam which had won first prize in the Inter-Vidyapeetha Youth Festival in Allahabad in February 1987. The drama was staged under the auspices of Veda Vidya Pratishtham in the Mavalankar Hall which was full to its capacity. It won highest applause from the public and the prominence alike and the Vidyapeetha later received many invitations to perform it elsewhere.

HISTORY

The erstwhile Shri Raghunath Sanskrit Mahavidyalaya established by the King, Shri Ranbir Singh of J & K was taken over as Shri Ranbir Kendriya Sanskrit Vidyapeetha on 1st April, 1971.

Students from Prathama to Acharya are taught here in Sahitya, Navya Vyakarana, Phalit Jyotisha and Sarva Darshana, Shiksha Shastri was started in 1979 for the training of Sanskrit Teachers. The modern subjects like Hindi, Dogri, English, Political Science and History are taught alongwith the traditional subjects up to the Shastri level.

The Kashmir Shaiv Darshan Project is running in this Vidyapeetha to compile a Dictionary of Kashmir Shaiv Darshan. The work is in progress and is expected to be completed within one and half years.

The Vidyapeetha is running since 1.4.1971 in 8 rented buildings. The State Government of J & K has allotted land at Bhaawal for the building of the Vidyapeetha.
